Strathbogie residents urged to use their e-waste bin properly

Strathbogie residents are being urged to use their e-waste bin properly. Strathbogie Shire Environment and Waste Coordinator Molly Odgers said the bin at the Strathbogie Recreation Reserve was established to help residents dispose of their e-waste without having to travel to an appropriate drop-off point. However, she said there was now continual dumping of household waste at the bin.

The Victorian Government last year banned e-waste from all landfills to protect the environment. At this time a 600L bin was made available at Strathbogie to encourage the correct disposal of e-waste.

The environmentally friendly disposal of e-waste has become a major concern in recent years, as levels are increasing three times faster than standard municipal waste.

While many residents are correctly disposing of e-waste through Strathbogie Shire's resource recovery centres, the Strathbogie bin is not being used correctly. Ms Odgers urged the community to please use the bin correctly. "Dumping household waste in the e-waste bin is essentially littering and is disrespectful to the environment and the Strathbogie community," she said. "This illegal dumping is not only harmful, but unsightly and also encourages further dumping in the area."

"We take pride in keeping our Shire clean and we want to do the right thing by our ratepayers. If this practice continues, we may have to remove the bin."

What is e-waste?

E-waste is any item with a cord, plug or battery that is no longer working or wanted.

This covers a whole range of everyday household items, such as mobile phones, white goods and home entertainment products. E-waste often contains hazardous materials and dangerous chemicals.

What should I do with e-waste?

E-waste should not be placed in your kerbside bins. The Shire encourages residents to dispose of their e-waste through a dedicated collection service (see below list).

Henry's Tree

We found this magnificent old mountain swamp gum (*Eucalyptus camphora*) on Carpenters Track. This species has a fairly limited distribution and is very similar to the swamp gum (*E. ovata*), which has a larger distribution, mainly across southern Victoria. They are, as their name implies, often on lower, wetter ground and along creeks, so are a great species to use if you are replanting around degraded wetlands. Mountain swamp gums do not normally grow to a great height, but massive old trees like this are important habitat trees, that will form hollows suitable for wildlife. Both common ringtail possums and koalas feed on this species locally.

Specific Reports from Project Leaders

B2B extensions: progress continues toward surrounding the Township in a 12 – 15km bushwalk. Two more years of woody weed control is funded. A Taungurung crew working with Parks Vic will be completing the next stage of woody weed control. Stock exclusion fencing has been accepted by 2 landholders. Signage and trail markers are in situ from Magiltan Creek through to Armstrong Avenue bridge. GB CMA will fund woody weed control along Nganganu Trail.

Bogie Backyard: cancelled due to COVID-19 from March. To resume in partnership with the local school next year. Kath Handasyde expressed her interest in joining Sean and Bert with Joe, Susie and the kids.

Grants: a powerful battery brushcutter has been purchased, the GPS device for weed logging has been returned to the supplier due to poor performance and is to be replaced.

Platypus monitoring: Numbers remain consistent

Common Mynah traps: 2 out, 1 available

David Jamieson reported on the Pasture Demonstration Sites: still being monitored and assessed. Giberallic Acid first assessment contributed to a 23% increase in winter growth. Molybdenum application starts soon.

Roadside Weeds: Council spraying continues, but could be more efficient and effective. This season spayed roadsides were graded soon after, negating benefit. Next year SL & STAG Roads Committee will time and direct. St John's Wort has \$1,500 of Shire funding secured. RWPP has at least another year with \$6,000 coming from State Government.

Landcare Facilitator Kerri Robson has been funded until the end of June, 2020.

Creightons Creek and Burnt Creek Landcare Groups are part of Granite Creeks Blackberry Action Group. .Strathbogie Landcare invited to join - a committee member is required to put a hand up for this.

Henry O'Connor reported Bird Surveys should recommence upstream of Smiths Bridge before the end of the year.

Membership renewals are due for the coming year. See page 2 for EFT instructions.



Dr Robert who is the RSL State President gave me permission to forward his statement to you for publication in Tableland Talk. I believe it gives a balanced view of the Afghanistan situation as

highlighted in the Brereton Report:

Today the Chief of the Defence Force (CDF) released the long-awaited Afghanistan Inquiry, also known as the Brereton report. The report outlines very serious allegations of wrongdoing by a small number of current or former ADF personnel between 2005-2016.

The alleged behaviour in the Brereton report, if true, is unacceptable and would be seen by a vast majority of ADF and veterans as abhorrent. However, we need to be mindful that at this stage these are allegations, and those accused of war crimes are entitled to due process through the court system and the presumption of innocence. These are extremely complicated situations and we must let the process take its course.

To everyone who served in Afghanistan, in any role, you should be justly proud of your contribution. You made a difference, and you served your country with honour. Nothing will ever change that. Be proud and stand tall. The RSL has always been there for our veterans, and at this time, the wellbeing of veterans directly and indirectly involved must be our priority.

RSL Victoria can help connect current members of the ADF and veterans with counselling and mental health support as well as direct welfare, advocacy and wellbeing services. 

The Name Game: Troublesome names

Yes indeed – some scientific names seem to have been designed to cause arguments and misunderstandings. A case in point is Australopithecus africanus: a name which may suggest a creature with both Australian and African connections. It turns out that this is in fact the case, but not for what might appear to be the obvious reasons. Remember that Australia's name is based on the Latin word australis, southern, so australo-could apply to any animal (or plant) in the southern hemisphere, without any necessary Australian connection. And of course the second part of the name, africanus, is a clear reference to Africa. So what's the real Australian connection, then? The originator of the name, Raymond Dart, was Australian-born, though he spent most of his career in South Africa, which is where he discovered and described *Australopithecus africanus* in 1924.



What sort of creature is Australopithecus africanus? It's a primate, the order of mammals which also includes humans; indeed it's a highly significant, world-famous specimen. The individual on which the name was based (at

that time the only one known) was an infant about three years old which lived about 2.4 million years ago. Taking its common name from the site where it was found, it became popularly known as the Taung infant. What's so special about it? Any primate fossil attracts extra attention, but Dart's interpretation of the infant caused a global sensation: he argued that it lay in the direct line of human ancestry, providing a very ancient link between apes and humans. If you accepted that the human species evolved from a non-human ancestor then you would expect such a creature to have existed, but the controversy arose from the particular characteristics of Dart's discovery. The key question is: How do you draw a line between apes and humans? The British Museum in London was the seat of established wisdom in regard to human ancestry, and its yardstick was centred on brain size. The enormous brain is such a hallmark of humanity that the favoured notion was that increase in brain size would have led the way, with other aspects of human distinction later following the brain's lead.

But the infant didn't fulfil this expectation at all. Dart calculated that as an adult it's brain would have been no bigger than a chimpanzee's, whereas its jaws, teeth and smoothly-rounded cranium were much more humanoid than ape-like. So, inevitably, the establishment descended on Dart like a ton of bricks: they emphatically dismissed the infant as just an ordinary ape, with nothing much to distinguish it from a

chimpanzee. STRATHBOGIE TABLELAND ACTION GROUP INC.

STAG's November meeting (by zoom) was attended by our new councillor, Cr Laura Binks, the CEO, Julie Salomon and Director Corporate Operations, David Roff. The following outlines issues raised and responses that have since been received from the CEO.

Communication

The committee expressed concern at the level of communication between Council and the community. Problems include delayed responses, a need for more clarity as to whom issues should be addressed and the need for better internal communication between staff and departments. These issues were acknowledged.

Spring Creek Picnic Area

Issues relating to this project (which Council commenced in 2017) remain unresolved at the time of going to print.

Emergency Management

• Access to water for the CFA on Mackrells Lane – Guardrail contractor will undertake removal works when on site on 22 December. It is also proposed to regrade the alignment of the road to reshape curve which will allow for removal of length of guardrail to allow good access for fire truck.

Action to be taken in relation to the dead trees on the Strathbogie/Euroa Road is hopefully being addressed.

On a positive note STAG was advised that:

- Ember proofing of the Place of Last Resort has been funded
- The site licence for the new shed is currently being signed by the CFA and Council. (According to Steph Ryan's office funding has been allocated in the recent State budget for fifteen new fire stations however, at this stage, the stations have not been identified).

Installation of the tank and generator at the Rec Ground will be completed by mid-December. The generator will come with a lockable protective and acoustic cover.

Community Planning Program

Julie Salomon advised that the review of this program would take place in the first quarter of 2021 and will involve consultation with the Action Groups. She also acknowledged the importance of combined meetings for the Action Groups which have not occurred for several years.

Road Marking

STAG once again reinforced the importance of yellow lines on roads on the Tableland. This matter is still unresolved.

Roadside Shoulder Spraying

STAG has repeatedly advised Council that the timing of this spraying should not be aligned to other areas in the Shire which have an earlier growth period. The CEO has agreed that spraying next season will be as required for the Tableland.

Footpath to the Rec Reserve

All consultation and delivery of the path is scheduled for completion late February.

Closure of the Veranda at the Rec Pavilion

This work is scheduled for completion April 2021.

Access at Polly McQuinns

Advice from the contractor is that they will be on site 22 December to undertake works.

While there are still some issues to be resolved, our meeting with representatives from Council has resulted in a number of positive outcomes for the community.

Covid Community Grants

STAG has applied for a grant to update the host for the community website, purchase free-standing hand sanitising units for the Hall and the Rec Pavilion and to refurbish the community noticeboard. It is expected that these grants will be announced early December.

AGM

Following guidelines from Consumer Affairs, STAG has postponed its AGM until March 2021.

Christmas

The Rec Committee is investigating options that may enable them to organise some sort of Christmas event that will not breach existing Covid guidelines.

Smartphone Stories Victoria has been funded through the Vic Health – Art of Good Health Partnerships Grants program and is a creative arts-based project that contributes to health and wellbeing by reducing social isolation, building self-esteem and strengthening community connection through accessible filmmaking practices.


