

FROM YOUR EDITOR

And occasionally we have one-offs, like Matt Delahey's wonderful story about his trip to Sweden, Angus Martin's stories about echidnas and Kenya, Bert Lobert's articles about trees and drought and bandicoots, and various stories about the lives of people who live or have lived up here.

Helena McLaughlin has helped me with TT together from time to time and her contribution was valuable – thanks, Helena. She is now no longer available, which provides an occasion to review how we put TT together and to see who else is interested in contributing. For example, I would love to see more articles. Anyone can send in a story or something of interest. It does not have to be a monthly commitment, or long, but it would be great to have more variety. It would also be great to know of people who are willing to be approached to write something on a specific topic – a commissioned piece, if you like. Some of my ideas are:



SAVE YOUR CORKS PLEASE!!

A favour to ask of all readers of TT. If you normally throw your corks in the rubbish bin, please bundle them into a bag for me. Motor Neurone Disease (MND) Vic. has a fundraising program called "Equipment, It's a Corker" and all corks donated are used to buy equipment for people suffering from MND.

MND kills around 500 Australians each year and at this stage there is no cure. MND affects speech and mobility and causes muscles to gradually weaken, eventually causing death, usually between 1 and 3 years from diagnosis.

My mum died on 16th December last year from MND. She was diagnosed approx 14 months prior to her death. It is a cruel disease and it was heartbreaking for us all to watch her suffering. She was the fittest 75 year old & we all thought she would live to see her 100th birthday.

By collecting and recycling corks I can make a little bit of difference to other families going through the MND journey and help them provide much needed equipment .

The stats are:

Approx 234 corks = 1kg

= 1kg 666kg = \$1,000 **\$1,000 = a manual wheelchair with accessories**

them from you, or drop them in my mailbox or at the school and I can pick them up from there.


What a Day!

Hume Corridor Community Outreach Health Service (located in the Violet Town Bush Nursing Centre)

Thank you to everyone who completed our recent survey and participated in the Focus Group discussions. We had 232 surveys completed which has provided us with valuable information to help us plan and deliver a service based on community needs.

The most important health issue identified by the community was depression followed by obesity, drought related issues, cardiovascular disease, alcohol consumption and diabetes.

The services the community thought were lacking within this area were GP services, physiotherapy, podiatry and Mental Health workers.

The most important issue impacting on community access to and use of local health services was lack of a General Practitioner followed by being unaware of the health services in the area, opening hours and distance to health services.

Zucchini Slice

- 1 onion, diced
- 2 medium zucchini's, grated
- 1 cup SR flour
- 4 eggs
- 1 cup grated cheese
- 2 tablespoons oil
- Salt and pepper

Combine all ingredients in an oven proof dish.

Cook at 180°C for about 40-50 minutes. Cut into small piece and serve with a salad.
