
The Strathbogie Tableland Action Group (STAG) invites you to a dinner to celebrate the good things that are happening up here on the Tableland and plan for the future.





Thankyou very much for the excellent production you and your team produce for our community every month and the diverse content contained in it, keeping the community informed of the happenings taking place on the Tableland.

It is also interesting to read the comments made by and perceptions held by some members of the community and I refer in particular to the article titled An Ode to P McQuinn by another Strathbogie Ghost in which credit is given to the Strathbogie Shire Council for gains to some organisations in the town.

Whilst I cannot comment in regard to the school buildings or walking trail I can comment on the painting of St Andrew's Uniting Church in Main Street. Some years ago the Stag Committee approached the Church asking whether the church would be interested in applying for a grant as part of beautifying the main street. The church accepted this offer however no funds were ever received from the Shire or other body.

For the communities information the recent painting of the Church both internally and externally has been funded solely by the congregation from funds raised by efforts of members, and in particular from the former Ladies Guild who undertook catering for functions in the community. No funds toward the works has been received from the Shire or any other organisation.

The walk is approximately an hour and a BBQ lunch will be provided.




WIRE & WATER

I have read, with interest, correspondence in the most recent Tableland Talk about the P McQuinn column published in the February edition.

I am alarmed by the raising of the spectre of Editorial Policy in respect of what is, after all, a community funded newsletter which gives community members a forum for sharing information and expressing opinion. Tableland Talk already has a Statement of Purpose which is a clear and sufficient expression of community expectation about contributions to the newsletter. In my view it is all the editorial policy we need.

I also believe anonymity is sometimes necessary to

I also believe anonymity is sometimes necessary to protect against retaliation and to ensure community members have access to information they may not otherwise have. I would also strongly argue against censorship of articles critical of Council beyond ensuring content is not libellous or unlawful.

I am surprised that the P McQuinn column is seen as a barrier to a positive working relationship with Council; indeed if success is measured by outcome, the column elicited a favourable response and a promise by Council to reinstate the roadside clearance. While I agree that a positive relationship with Council is in our interest it must be a mature relationship which, while respectful, allows for plain speaking and yes, sometimes robust discussion.

I would submit that we do have such a relationship with Council which is to the credit of previous members of the Strathbogie Action Group and members of other community groups who have worked assiduously to establish the current positive relationship which has enriched our community.

- Maximum incentives of up to \$1200 per ha (conditions apply) for a 5 year management agreement.
- Fencing rate is a minimum of \$7 /m and increases depending on the size and quality of the site.
- Minimum width of corridors is 40m along streams and 20m in paddocks.
- Management actions could include fencing to manage stock, erosion control, revegetation, weed control, pest animal control and off stream watering points.

In Response to the Ghost

Am I imagining things? Or does the Strathbogie Ghost's Ode to P McQuin have a sniff of righteous disapproval about poor old Polly's column which reported and commented on a Council Officer's response to a question about the whereabouts of funds designated for roadside clearance.

Belittling P McQuinn as a thin skinned perpetual complainer should not blind us to the issue the McQuinn column highlighted; the blatant redirection by Council of scarce grant funding for use elsewhere.

The Ghost's attribution of gains to the community from Council largesse should not pass without challenge either

- School buildings were funded by the federal Government
- Painting of the church was funded by the church
- Bridge to Bridge was funded from grants obtained by Landcare and contributions by DSE and Goulburn Broken.

Of course Council does make a significant contribution to our community which is readily acknowledged even, as I suspect by P McQuinn, who should be thanked rather than disparaged for her column. Michael Hand The Strathbogie Shire has announced its 2012/2013 draft rating package on the 28th March. The 2012/2013 draft rating package, which will now go out for community consultation, will start the gradual process of repaying communities within the Strathbogie Shire for their ongoing support, in delivering what is undoubtedly a strategic, uncompromising rating regime, based on building sustainable communities for the future and protecting our assets by addressing the decline of valuable infrastructure such as roads, bridges and buildings.

Mayor of the Strathbogie Shire, Cr Mick Williams said "Whilst proposed rating increases will be set at 7 per cent for the 2012/2013 and 2013/2014 financial year, this is a significant decrease to the original forecasts for 2012/13 and 2013/14 of 9 per cent and 8 per cent respectively," said Mayor Williams.



I had a fun day. I like the waterfall at the creek and I am happy that the creek is healthy and I had a fun day.


Water Beasties
