



Several committee members are investigating requirements for this project.

Investigations have taken place. It is possible to provide wifi at the hall, but the cost is prohibitive.

Committee members examined options for a suitable township location. However, without capacity to manage donations, it was decided donations to Euroa's "Already Read" bookshop should be encouraged instead.


Hold an annual or biannual celebration of the spoken word "S P O KEN"

Hello Everyone,

Best wishes for 2018.

Council is back at work for the year, so I thought I would let you know what I see as the priorities for this year, and give you the chance to tell me what should be added to the list!

Fair Rates

We all know that we pay some of the highest Rates in Australia and while our relatively low population in a rural Shire with a large road and bridge network will always be a challenge, our Rates burden should be fairer. I think fair Rates means our charges being in line with comparable Shires. Rates and charges on a farm property valued at \$1 million in the Strathbogie Shire would be \$4,805. In the Mansfield Shire \$2,241. Council will set its budget for 2018/2019 in June.



Repairs to infrastructure from the rain event on 1st & 2nd December.

The Shire has applied for and received National Disaster Relief Funding to repair infrastructure damaged or destroyed by the December rains. The repairs will be a separate project from normal Shire maintenance and will be funded via the Victorian Government. Work will go to tender in February and commence in March. I understand that the delay to repairs is frustrating, particularly to residents who are seriously inconvenienced. It is important that the Shire is aware of all the damage caused by the rain, as anything not identified in the project will eventually need to be fixed by the Shire's maintenance program and this will take much longer. Continue the rollout of the Zero to One Road Upgrade


This Program which started in 2017 moves gravel roads with a residence that are currently a 'Zero Rated Road' (receive no regular maintenance) to a 'Class One Road' (included in the annual maintenance program). This program has started to make a real difference to residents and needs to keep expanding.

Roadside Management

The right balance needs to be found between potential fire fuel loads on the roadsides from fallen trees, weed and vermin control in the road reserve and preservation of native vegetation. A balanced roadside policy will be released and implemented this year.


Waste Management

The Strathbogie Tableland Landcare Alternate Fertiliser and Lime Trial Demonstration Sites

The aim of establishing an alternate fertiliser demonstration site on a Strathbogie farming property was to compare organic fertilisers with the traditional inorganic fertiliser, superphosphate. There are many organic fertilisers on the market. Eight well known products were selected to trial against single superphosphate.

The importance of this demonstration site was to investigate using livestock feed fertilisers under local conditions. Sowing pasture is expensive. Efficient feed management requires the most nutritious feed to be grown at the lowest price. The more growth per acre, the greater the livestock carrying rate. The more efficient and sustainable the growth, the more land use is improved, land degradation reduced and profit margins increased. Knowing the best way to manage pasture is essential for improved outcomes on all counts.

David Hamilton (BAgSc) generously volunteered his expertise as a farmer and land manager. David made available a large trial site on his Strathbogie property and appropriate equipment for working the demonstration plots. Utilising his farm ensured direct relevance of the demonstration to other primary producers working grazing properties in the Strathbogie Ranges and created significant interest elsewhere.

Research activity and evaluations were initiated and managed by a local committee consisting of David Jamieson, David Hamilton, Brian Law, Denis Taylor and Andrew Townsend. The process was supported by funding and further in kind support from Landcare's Gecko Clan, Granite Creeks and Strathbogie Tableland Landcare Group. Landcare Project Officer, Kerri Robson and were integral to the success of running the demonstrations. Support was also provided by Greg Becker from Agriculture Victoria. The Euroa Secondary College Year 9 Agriculture Group assisted with pasture cuts and scientific research.

Each product was applied to a 10 X 100 metre plot, with 4 replications and control plots in between. The method involved 3 – 4 years of prescribed pasture cuts on hands and knees using manual shears. The harvest was dried and weighed to measure the dry matter growth of each plot.

From a bang for your buck perspective, the results indicated that for each dollar per kilogram of fertiliser applied, single superphosphate delivered the highest weight of dry matter grown.

Further investigation involved allocating space & dividing the trial site into a 4

section rotational grazing unit to test whether grazing stock demonstrated a preference for feed grown using a specific fertiliser. There was no indication that stock would gravitate toward pasture grown using a specific fertiliser.

As well as delivering results, the alternate fertiliser demonstration sites proved to be successful in generating ongoing interest locally and further afield. Regular public Field Days continued to attract 40 - 50 attendees throughout the trial.

As the primary trial described above approached conclusion, the committee realised the demonstration site also presented an opportunity for a secondary investigation. This was an initiative designed to assess management techniques used to address the acidic nature of Strathbogie Tableland soil.

There have been many developments in the area of acid tolerant pasture species. 10 species are being compared in the context of controlled lime application. Only perennial species have been selected: 4 rye grasses, 3 crocksfoot and 3 phalaris. 3 comparative plots have been established for each species. One control plot without lime, one using 1 tonne per acre and one using 3 tonne per acre. Each plot has been replicated 5 times to test for consistency. All are being regularly grazed. Regular soil testing and species survival rates are being used as the comparative measures.

This demonstration site remains a work in progress. The next Field Day will be in au-

tumn. All are welcome.


