





But he is a good sport, Tutorials will be taught! For we who'll miss his bread He'll train us up instead



STRATHBOGIE TABLELAND LANDCARE GROUP NEWS

REPORT ON 2008 LANDCARE FORUM 'SHAPING OUR FUTURE' HELD AT NOVOTEL RESORT, CRESWICK on 29th-30th May.

Approximately 300-400 Landcarers attended the Forum.

After an impressive welcome by local indigenous people, Landcarers broke into groups of interest to hear the stories of different folk with emphasis on 11 different issues arranging from –

Revitalizing Landcare: Taking Landcare ethic into towns and cities: Sustainable farm-

ing; Building knowledge and skills in rural communities; Climate change; Finding our voice on local, regional and state issues; Engaging with indigenous Victorians; Action in rural/urban interface; Working with regions; Community business partnerships; Biodiversity.

There were many inspiring stories of groups taking action in most of these areas – too numerous to mention

I have chosen one that from my point of view was truly moving and inspirational. This was from Saint Francis Xavier Primary School, Ballarat East (see separate sheet).

The two Keynote Speakers gave a current and future appraisal of climate change and its effect with examples of possible scenarios that may appear by 2035 – very challenging stuff. It was meant to shock and it did. Remedies which are beyond the scope of Landcare alone will need full community involvement to make a substantial difference.

Friday morning was spent having people nominate action that they would like to be taken in different areas of concern.

A very useful exercise apart from the large carbon footprint caused by travelling to the Forum and running Forum over 2 days.

Hopefully outcomes will more than offset this.

A highlight of the Landcare Forum stories for me was 'Harmony Dreaming' by students of Saint Francis Xavier Primary School Ballarat East.

This story was told by 3 early primary school students (2 girls and 1 boy). They were telling their story to an audience of approximately 80 people and described the progress their school has made in achieving environmentally friendly projects within their campus. Such progress included a vegetable garden, tree planting. Indigenous message stick significance, enhancing biodiversity, recycling through to containing natural waste by means of septic tanks in next paddock, care of waterways.

Funding was derived through Australia Post and Bi-Lo.

The school children have received several awards recognizing their wonderful work and enthusiasm typified by their great presentation.

The audience was blown away when a young <u>man</u> I would estimate to be maybe 5-6 year old took the microphone, looked the audience in the eye and announced 'in conclusion..' and proceeded to wind up a wonderful presentation.

I don't think I have experienced such a universal feeling of warmth and admiration for such a young person, although it was tinged with pathos for some with the knowledge that little Jim and his friends will be working with a very different situation when he is grown up.

Which poses the question – are we giving little Jim's generation a fair go or are we borrowing from them? An Older Landcarer





"Establishing a local group for Growing Australian Plants"

A damp misty day was welcome on the 17th May. This did not dampen the enthusiasm of 20 or so people who gathered at Doug White's Property in Ruffy Road. The group were meeting to explore the potential of setting up a local group to support each other in leaning about and growing Australian native plants.



Participants were treated to a tour of Doug's garden and his fantastic collection of unique and unusual Australian plants. Doug's almost complete collection of Banksias from around Australia was a special treat with some displaying their beautiful flowers. There was much discussion on growing banksias, on soils, frost tenderness and propagating of these wonderful plants. Doug and Paul Kennedy, Vice President of SGAP shared their exhaustive knowledge generously

The group are keen to meet on a monthly basis, with a focus on enjoyment and leaning through visiting various gardens. The next meeting is scheduled for Saturday 26th July at 10.30 am.

The group will meet at Tony Court's property, 450 Longwood Ruffy Road, Longwood. The property is on the right hand side and 4.5 kilometres from the Old Highway. The day will be spent looking at plants that have survived under drought conditions and a fantastic collection of grevilleas that have proven hardy for the area. We will also have a look at a revegetation area of indigenous plants achieved through replanting and direct seeding. Please bring your own lunch and a chair. Tea and coffee will be available. Pet Health By Sarah (Veterinarian Nurse) Winter time and your Pet

While we are very good at looking after ourselves during the winter months, we often forget that our pets feel the cold as well. They look so cosy in their warm, furry jackets and cats especially seem to pass their days lazing on window sills in the sun or in the warmest spot on the lounge or bed.

It is important that owners of very young or very old pets take extra care during the winter months. Cold can be fatal for young puppies or kittens, particularly during the first few days after birth. Orphaned puppies are particularly susceptible. Older dogs and cats tend to have more sluggish

circulatory systems, which mean they are more likely to find it harder to keep warm in the cold weather despite their gorgeous, furry coats. Older dogs often suffer from arthritis and this is exasperated by the cold.

Pets with very short coats or pets with a low percentage of body fat such as Whippets or Greyhounds are also very susceptible to the cold and must be kept cosy during winter.

To protect your pets against the onset of the cold winter months, make sure they have a warm, safe place to sleep at night, away from any draughts and if your dog is an outdoor dog, be sure that his/her kennel is waterproof. Older animals should sleep on a cushioned bed that is elevated off the around

An extra blanket in their bed or kennel will make all the difference - - a natural fibre blanket such as wool is a good choice as it actually retains the heat much better than a synthetic blanket. If your dog or cat is very short-haired, they will benefit from the added warmth of a jacket when they go outside. There are some great ones available that are waterproof & weatherproof. Be sure to make sure jackets fit snugly but don't restrict movement in anyway.
