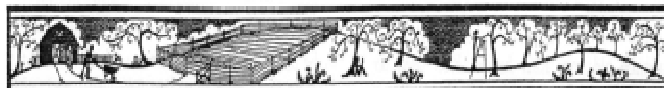

A Simple Quiche

Short Pastry - 225g flour, 110g cold butter (cubed), egg yolk, water (cold - put an icecube in it), pinch salt. Rub butter through flour, mix in egg yolk and a little water if needed. Shape into a ball and rest in fridge for at least two hours (will keep in fridge for a week).

After resting, roll out until about 5mm thick, and line a pie or quiche dish. Line with baking paper and add pie weights and blind bake for about 20 minutes (180C oven) until cooked. Let cool.

This pastry is good for many dishes.

Filling - mix half a cup milk, half a cup cream, half a cup grated cheese, two eggs, a little pepper and salt. Sweat some onion and bacon gently for about 10 minutes until soft. Add whatever else you might like - cooked mushroom, and/or spinach are good. Once cooled place in bottom of pastry case. Pour over egg mixture and cook in moderate oven until set - about 30 minutes. Lovely for lunch with a little side salad.

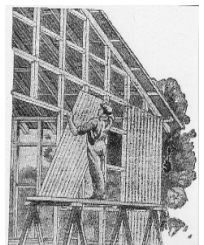

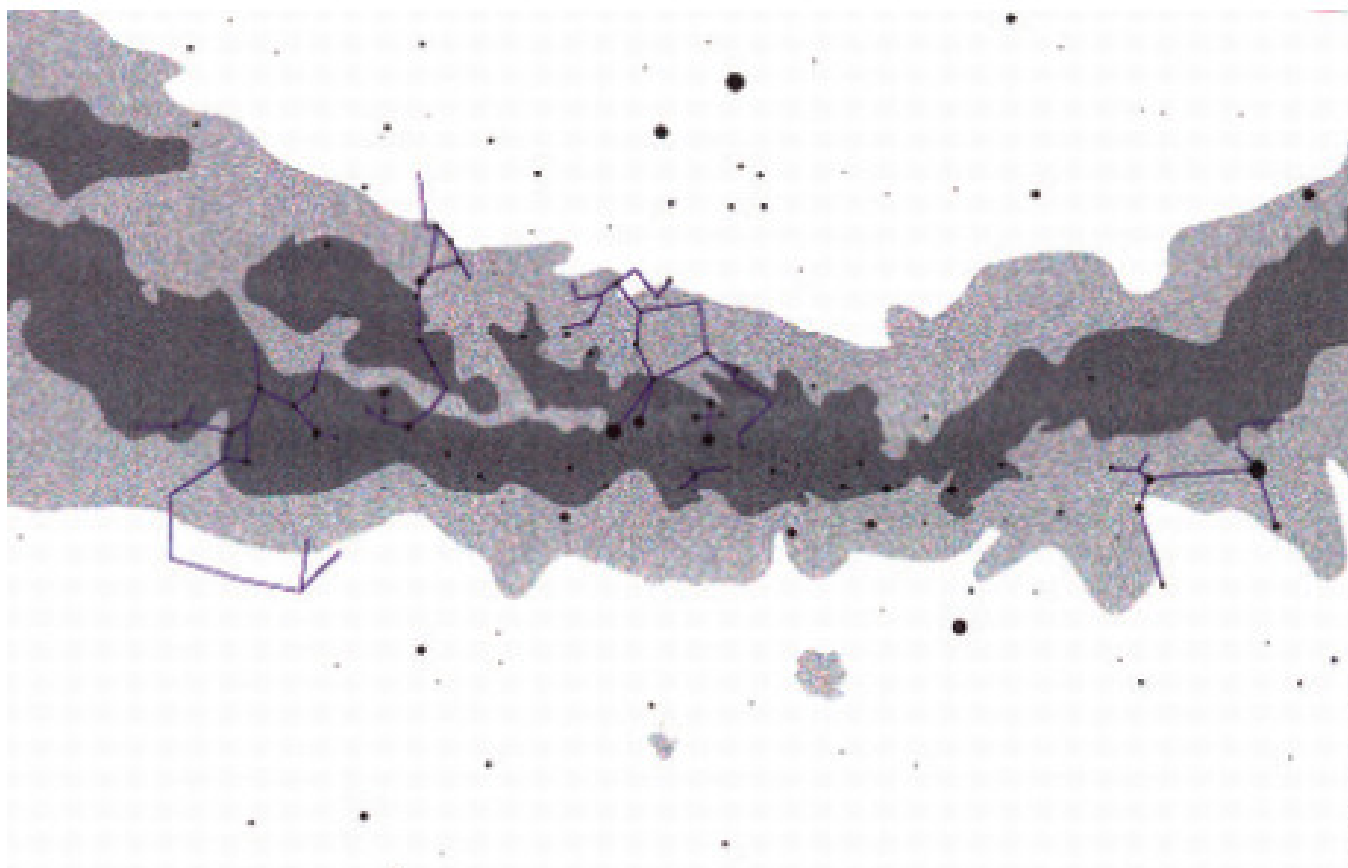

Stargazing in Strathbogie



The Milky Way

On a clear night in Strathbogie, when there is no moon out, we can see the ribbon of the Milky Way in all its beauty. This time of year just after sunset it can be seen stretching out from east to west. From our perspective the part of the galaxy that we recognize as the Milky Way, is the most densely populated part, holding nine tenths of all the visible stars, covering only one tenth of the night sky. The Milky Way galaxy is approximately 100,000 light years across and about 2,000 light years thick. The Sun is one of 100,000 million stars in the whole galaxy. It lies on one of the spiral arms approximately two thirds of the way out from the galactic centre, the hub of the system in the rich star fields of Sagittarius.

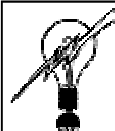
