





Notice of Annual General Meeting Monday 18 July commencing at 7.30pm in the Supper Room, Strathbogie Memorial Hall

Council believes that local communities are best at identifying and resolving local issues and that building 'community capacity' is essential to developing vibrant healthy communities. The Community Development Program was initiated by Council in 2005.

Through an extensive community consultation process, Community Action Plans have been developed by eight communities – each of these plans are used by the community and Council to focus on issues and projects of particular importance to that individual community, as well as giving overall direction to Council about ways in which to strengthen other rural townships of Shire.

To assist Action Groups to undertake projects, Council established the "Community Action Group Funding" program and has set aside funding specifically for projects listed as priorities in community action plans from the 2010 / 2011, \$200,000 community grants program.

The Strathbogie Tableland Action Group (STAG) was established in 2005. The *Strathbogie Tableland Action Plan* was developed by our community and *is owned by our community*. The action plan is a living document and enables changes to occur through the appropriate review processes. The Strathbogie Community Action Plan can be viewed on the Strathbogie website - go www.strathbogie.vic.gov.au.

STAG has undertaken, and in many cases successfully sought funding for, the following projects:

Development of a local telephone directory

Upgrading computer facilities for our local newssheet, Tableland Talk

Tree planting and tidying in the main street

Development and management of our own community website

Refurbishment of the information board in the main street

Improvement to signage on several dangerous intersections on the Tableland

and repainting of lines on a number of roads

Community clearing sale

Community supper dance

CPR training session for community members

Provided a submission on behalf of the community to the Victorian Bushfires Royal Commission

In consultation with representatives from CFA, SES and Shire, developed and distributed to residents of the Tableland an Emergency Resource package focussing initially on bushfires and, more recently, on other emergencies Successfully lobbied Telstra and government to provide improved mobile phone and broadband reception on the Tableland

Successfully lobbied Council to provide a pedestrian bridge over Spring Creek and connecting walkway to the school

Produced a flyer outlining places of interest on the Tableland

STAG is also continually raising issues with Council – these include development of a Township Protection Plan for Strathbogie, identification of a suitable location on the Tableland for a Neighbourhood Safer Place as well as road, traffic and other matters.

Some committee members have been involved with STAG since its inception and have indicated their intention to retire from the committee at the 2011 AGM. They have put in a lot of hard work and feel it is now time to hand over to other members of the community to become actively involved in their community.

It is important that STAG remains viable and that Council funding continues to feed into the community – so we are seeking new members for the committee. 





The art of the limerick 7: playing with rhyme




There was a young lady in Gloucester

The 22nd of June marks the Winter Solstice, the shortest day of the year, it all happens due to the way the Earth rotates at a tilt to its plane of orbit, and in consequence the celestial equator is tilted with respect to the ecliptic at 23°26'. For one half of the year the Sun is north of the equator, for the other half it is south, and the variation produces changes in the length of day and night and in the seasons. The ecliptic and celestial equator cross at two points, 180° apart, these points are called exquinoxes. When the sun arrives at either of these points, day and night are of equal lengths worldwide. After the March equinox the Sun moves North of the equator until it reaches the maximum declination of 23°26' at the solstice (*Lat.*,= sun stands still – for several days before and after each solstice the sun appears to stand still in the sky, i.e. its noon time elevation dose not appear to change from day-to-day). It then rises toward the September equinox, crosses South of the equator, and moves towards its maximum South declination of 23°26' at the opposite solstice around the 22nd of December.
