STAG has written to Councillors requesting that the construction of two footpaths to be created in the township be included in the new Council Plan:

One from Main Street to the Rec Ground – this section of road is

used by schoolchildren both on foot and riding bicycles and has a bend at the northern end making it difficult to see oncoming traffic. The recreation ground also has the only public toilet available to visitors to the town.

Smiths Bridge to the township – this road has a constant bend and small verges, making it difficult to move off the road in a hurry. It is used by local residents walking in to town as well as community members and visitors who walk the Bridge to Bridge track.




This report will provide Council with a comprehensive guide on how our residents feel about how Council is tracking with the services they provide to the community.





News from our local Councillor—Alistair Thomson

Thank you again to the Tableland Talk team for giving me the opportunity to inform the community about what the Strathbogie Shire is doing for the residents of the Tableland.

Over the past month, Council has been busy completing three key documents, a) the Council Plan, b) the Budget for 2017/18 and c) the Road Management Plan.

Council has attempted to build a Council Plan around the needs and

wants of the residents and ran the "Let's Talk" process to gain the views of as many residents as possible. Every submission and idea was reviewed by Councillors and discussed in the light of the priorities set by the Council and the budgetary position. Clearly it is not possible to provide everything to everybody, however, I hope that as a Council we have done the best possible job to prioritise the wishes of our residents within the resource constraints that will always exist.

However, residents have another opportunity to suggest improvements to both the Council Plan and 2017/18 Budget. Both documents will be placed on public exhibition during May and residents can make submissions on these documents. Submissions will be heard in June.

The April Shire Council Meeting was held at the Strathbogie Memorial Hall. Thank you to those residents who attended and asked questions. Thank you also to those residents who attended the drop-in session regarding the proposed NBN tower on Kibbles Road.

Input from residents can make a difference and this is shown in the Road Management Plan that Council adopted on 18 April. Council has heard loud and clear that the state of the unsealed (gravel) roads is below what residents expect. In the Road Management Plan, Council has committed to upgrading "zero rated" roads (gravel roads that do not receive maintenance) to Class 1 roads (regularly maintained) as resources allow. A start will be made in 2017/18 although the full program will take some time to complete. Ultimately 200+ inhabited properties (and many farm entrances) that do not currently receive road maintenance will do so.

Finally, I would like you to know about a couple of programs now open:


- 1. The Strathbogie Shire Business Awards is accepting nominations until the end of April


KITCHEN GARDEN
