

STRATHBOGIE TABLELAND ACTION GROUP

Community Action Plan

Every four years STAG is required to consult with the community to develop the Community Action Plan. Our current Plan was developed in 2015 and is therefore not due to be revised until 2019. At its last meeting STAG decided to seek input from the community to expand the existing Plan and identify any additional projects that would tie in with the current Plan. A copy of the Plan is available on the community website www.strathbogie.org and the following actions have been or are currently being undertaken:

- Painting of the sides and rear of the hall
- Telstra exchange will shortly be painted with the design recently chosen by the community
- Plans for picnic facilities at the Spring Creek Bridge car park area are being developed with the Shire and will be available to the community prior to construction
- Quotes have been received to install new signage on the three main entrance roads to the township
- Following professional advice the trees in the main street were relocated to the rec ground and new trees planted
- The community pizza oven has been completed and is fully operational
- STAG contributed to the upgrade of sporting facilities at the rec ground for the recent Peranbin sports
- Following a request from STAG, a pathway from the Spring Creek bridge area to the rec reserve is on the current Council Plan
- Two new picnic tables have been installed at Pollys, safety measures have been addressed, the old noticeboard has been refurbished and a new noticeboard (with information re the source and use of the water, history of the wall and bridge, how it was named, species of fish, etc) will be installed in the next few weeks
- Assisted with the purchase of a photocopier for printing Tableland Talk
- The community directory is regularly updated on the website
- A Personal Fire Plan was developed and distributed to the community prior to the last fire season.
- Conducted community lunches to replace the previously Shire run Seniors lunches
- STAG's Roads sub-committee constantly monitors road issues and draws them to Council's attention

Council Meeting

Committee members also regularly attend Council meetings and the annual budget information meeting. Several committee members attended the Council meeting in Avenel on 17th October where two motions were discussed at length.

The first "That the Strathbogie Shire Council supports the retention of Australia Day celebrations on the 26th January each year" was ultimately passed four to two with one Councillor abstaining.

The second motion is still unresolved.

- a) That the Strathbogie Shire Council start the statutory process under the Local Government Act 1989 to reappoint the current CEO Steven Mark Crawcour without advertising the position for a period of no longer than 18 months from the completion of the current contract which is 31st August 2018.
- b) That the Strathbogie Shire Council commence discussions with the current CEO Steven Mark Crawcour in relation to contract terms and conditions.

The meeting was adjourned until Monday 23rd October to enable legal advice to be sought. This second was adjourned shortly after commencement to enable further advice to be sought in relation to "conflict of interest". This motion will now be discussed at a meeting on Monday 13th November commencing at 6pm at the Euroa Council Chambers and will be open to the public.

Spring Creek Picnic Facilities

At its recent meeting STAG was advised by representatives of the Working Party that:

- the building will most likely be oblong in shape and will accommodate two picnic tables
- the location will be on Council land above the creek fence on a level similar to path access
- a bar-b-que will be provided

The meeting was advised that Landcare is currently undertaking a project in this area and details of this have been forwarded to Council. Concern was expressed by several members of the committee in relation to issues of traffic management and rubbish removal if there is an increased use of this area. Cr Thomson advised that final recommendations will come out to the community for comment but not for approval. The path to from the Spring Creek bridge area to the rec ground will now be included in the future footpath and trails strategy. It has been rated as medium priority at an estimated cost of \$31,000.

Community Telephone Directory

It is anticipated that the community phone directory will be updated and reprinted in the coming months however this is quite a large task and we will need to rely on community input to identify residents who are new to the Tableland and those who no longer live here. The electronic version of the directory is available on the community website (strathbogie.org) and is updated whenever new information is received.

NBN Tower

Following a question at a recent STAG meeting re the status of the NBN tower, Cr Thomson advised that there were no objections at VCAT and the tower will go ahead.

Christmas Decorations

There have been some suggestions Christmas decorations be put up in the township. Kim Usher has agreed to liaise with residents – please contact him if you would like to assist.

Strathbogie Tableland Landcare Group AGM Report

LANDCARE
As part of the 2017 STLG AGM, Landcare members gathered at Spring Creek Bridge to walk along Spring Creek to Magiltan Creek and assess the effectiveness of last season's Landcare sponsored woody weed treatment. The impact has been positive and significant. With a view to improving indigenous habitat and access for walkers, this work paves the way for further treatment this season.

Following the walk, members gathered at Under the Sun for the formal part of the meeting, accompanied by hot soup, fresh bread and beverages. Acting President Bert Lobert presented the annual report outlining other STLG projects: Lime Trials, Bridge to Bridge maintenance, roadside weed and rabbit control, indigenous plant sales and collaboration with local community groups and authorities.

Julian Trescowthick's Treasurer's Report showed STLG to be in good financial health, with adequate surplus available to continue planned expenditure for the ongoing projects outlined above in the coming financial year. Committee member David Jamieson reported on STLG collaboration with Strathbogie Shire regarding assessment of roadside condition and a move to November spraying that is designed to prolong the knockdown of roadside weeds. David also reported on this month's Lime Trial Field Day at David Hamilton's. These trials are designed to investigate the best application models for acidic soils.

The 2017 Committee was unanimously elected.



Other items discussed included:

The regular inclusion of an STLG article in Tableland Talk as a substitute for the STLG Newsletter.

A motion regarding improvement of the Spring Creek picnic ground and riparian zone.

After the most recent STAG meeting, where Cr Alistair Thomson indicated Council interest in better utilising Council land along the creek, STLG has written to Council seeking to cooperate in improvement and consistent management of these areas.

Strathbogie Community Fuel (Diesel) Proposal Survey

Several community members have been talking with a fuel supplier about the possibility of a diesel fuel point in Strathbogie. This would be an unmanned above ground system with a swipe card system for payment. The idea is to get good fuel up here (including winter diesel so we don't have issues with fuel freezing on those frosty mornings) that will be around 4c per litre cheaper than nearby places, and for some of the profits to go back to our community. There obviously needs to be a lot of work done before this will happen, and the first thing is to find out how many people would purchase fuel up on the tableland. A survey has been sent out on

Bogie Tree, and there are paper copies of the survey at the Strathbogie Store and Under The Sun for those who are not on Bogie Tree.



Councillor News

Hello Again,

Local government is an easy target for criticism, and sometimes it is well deserved. The target is even bigger when Council finds itself on the front page of the Euroa Gazette discussing items such as Australia Day celebrations and the process for appointing the Shire Chief Executive (CEO). Over the past fortnight, I have had around 30 residents email or telephone me about these matters, so I would like to clarify what has gone on. The



most common criticism when these topics come up is why is the council not spending its time focussed on roads, rubbish and other essential services? Well, I can assure everyone, that the vast majority of Council's time is focussed on infrastructure maintenance, service delivery, planning permits, etc. However, the legislation outlining what Councils need to do is very broad and covers economic growth, social issues, quality of life strategies, etc. It is because of this requirement that Council does need to discuss matters like the celebration of Australia Day. To be very clear, Council at no point proposed to alter the date of celebrating Australia Day. At the Council meeting on 17 October, Councillors who had not supported a motion in September to consult with the Shire's Indigenous community about how the day is celebrated, moved a motion to reaffirm celebrations being on 26th January. I asked for this motion to be withdrawn and abstained from voting because, regardless of the motion passing or failing, nothing would have changed about the Australia Day celebrations. Motions that serve no purpose do waste Council time. With regard to the process for appointing the Shire's CEO, my position is very clear. The Shire needs to embark on a professional process that ensures the best candidate is appointed.

Back now to the more important matter of local government doing better. We interact with local government many times each day through using roads, roadsides, rubbish collection, street lights, parks, pools, libraries, etc. Council wants to deliver these services to the standard expected by the community.

The community alerting Council to problems, is an important way of improving service. Whether it's potholes, trees down, or any other problem, there are a number of ways to report the issue:

- Over the counter at the Shire Office

Photos of the problem are always helpful. When you report the issue you will be given a reference number. This number enables you to check progress on the resolution of the matter.






Stargazing in Strathbogie

"TARGA HIGH COUNTRY RETURNS TO STRATHBOGIE SHIRE"

One of the biggest road rallies in Australia is coming back to the Strathbogie Shire this November.



Three short-term road closures have been approved by Council for the eighth annual Targa **Strathbogie** High Country rally on Friday, 10 November.

All vehicles involved in the competitive rally will stop in Binney Street, Euroa for lunch and a public car display, as they have done in previous years.

The roads affected by the event (and the times they are closed) are:

- Galls Gap Road (between Euroa-Mansfield Road and Kippings Road) 9am-3pm
- Harry's Creek Road (between Creek Junction Road and Hays Road) 9.35am-3pm
- Binney Street, Euroa (between Railway Street and Brock Street) 10.08am-2.38pm

Strathbogie Shire Mayor Amanda McClaren said Targa Australia have sent letters to each resident/ratepayer with properties in the 3666 and 3669 postcodes informing them of the closures and event.

"In addition to this, Council will arrange letters to be mailed to specific properties located on both the Galls Gap Road and Harry's Creek Road legs where the property address and mailing address do not match," she said. "Council reminds residents who live on they closed roads that they will not be able to leave their homes or access their properties during this time until the roads are re-opened."

She said the entire region would be promoted around the world during the event.

"This is a very big thing for our community and will do wonders for the local economy as well as showcase what our beautiful Shire has to offer in terms of scenery and attractions," she said.

In the case of medical emergencies occurring for affected residents during the road closure period, the race will be stopped to allow access of emergency vehicles. Targa will also have an intensive care paramedic on site which will enable faster than normal access to medical treatment. Marshals will be stationed at all road closure points during the closures, providing advice to drivers of approaching vehicles of alternative detour routes to the specific destination they are seeking. The Strathbogie Park (corner of Euroa-Strathbogie Rd and Spring Creek Rd) picnic structure project team: Rob

Collyer (Shire Project Manager); Doug Watson (STAG); Tony Dawson and Cr Alistair Thomson, has produced a recommendation regarding the appropriate picnic structure for the park area. We are now welcoming comment from the community.

At right is a picture of a similar structure. Larger colour versions of the structure are available for inspection at 'Under the Sun' and on the noticeboard at the Strathbogie store.

Key points of the structure are:

- Measures 6 metres x 4 metres (to fit two table & chair sets & barbecue)
- Posts will be either timber or galvanised steel to ground level (not on a visible stirrup)
- Colorbond roof
- Muted colour (probably green/grey)
- Concrete slab base
- Located on low profile terrain between the old saleyards and creek

Giving voice to asylum seekers' experiences

This thoughtful, quietly involving documentary from director, Steve Thomas, gives us stories of freedom and tales of the everyday. Its subjects all came to Australia seeking refuge, and all spent time in detention, some for months, some for years. All are now Australian citizens. *Freedom Stories* focuses on what has happened to them since then, and its participants relate their experiences with candour and self-awareness. It's an uplifting experience.

The Rohingya people are a Muslim minority group residing in the Rakhine state of Myanmar. According to historians, "Rohingyas have been living in Arakan (now known as 'Rakhine') from time immemorial." The Rohingya people are considered 'stateless entities', as the Myanmar government has been refusing to recognise them as one of the ethnic groups of the country. For this reason, the Rohingya people lack legal protection from the government of Myanmar and face strong hostility in the country. The Rohingya are described as one of the most persecuted people on earth.
