STAG's Emergency Sub-committee has responded to the issues identified in earlier workshops as being areas that need to be addressed to improve our emergency readiness. Come to the Community Information Day and we will:

- Provide you with a "Personal Fire Plan" which can be adapted for your individual use; the plan will include a map and relevant contact numbers and websites to assist you.
- Identify your CFA map location
- Scan valuable documents on to a USB (memory stick) (please bring a USB if you would like us to do this – they are available from the Post Office, Officeworks, etc)
- Provide details of suppliers of equipment such as UHF radios, protective gear, etc. If there is sufficient interest, STAG would investigate bulk purchase prices.
- Establish a register of vulnerable/isolated persons with the local Fire Captain. (We are aware that both the Shire and Police already have registers however these are confidential and would most likely be used in the event of a major emergency. In the event of a small fire on the Tableland, it is important that the Fire Captain is aware of any vulnerable persons in that location.)
- Provide information on Fireguard Groups


After many, many phone calls to explain that the tractor didn't go that speed, it was finally explained that the Rego was actually a South Australian plate.



The Bookshelf – notes from the Bohomians Bookclub

A Man called Ove by Fredrik Backman, trans. Henning Koch, 2012 People call 59-year-old Ove the *the bitter neighbor from hell*. He is grumpy, opinionated and bound by a set of routines that any army major would be proud of. To say he is 'quick to anger' is a gross understatement. He also refuses to smile. He even points at people he has taken a dislike to for no discernible reason. The local residents' associationis fed up with him. So what makes Ove tick, and how on earth are his new neighbours going to get to first base with him?





The writing is accomplished. This is the first of Fredrik Backman's three novels and, although the reviews have suggested that it presents a somewhat Disneyfied version of reality, the author shows his journalistic training in resisting hyperbole. Henning Koch's translation from the Swedish is good, and so we are enticed to read on and discover how positivity, warmth and cookies on the doorstep can win over the most hardened heart, even the local residents' association!

Carl Fredrik Backman is a Swedish columnist, blogger and writer. In addition to *A Man called Ove*, he has also written *My Grandmother Asked Me To Tell You* (2013) *She's Sorry* and *Britt-Marie Was Here* (2015). They were all bestsellers in his native Sweden and have been published around the world in more than twenty-five languages. *A Man Called Ove* was adapted as a film with the same title in December, 2015.



















The Bookshelf – notes from the Bohomians Bookclub

The Dressmaker by Rosalie Ham, Duffy & Snellgrove, 2000

A darkly satirical novel of love, revenge, and 1950s haute couture ...


After twenty years spent mastering the art of dressmaking at couture houses in Paris, Tilly Dunnage returns to the small Australian town she was banished from as a child. She plans only to check on her ailing mother and leave. But Tilly decides to stay, and though she is still an outcast, her lush, exquisite dresses prove irresistible to the prim women of Dungatar. Through her fashion business, her friendship with Sergeant Farrat—the town's only policeman, who harbours an unusual passion for fabrics—and a budding romance with Teddy, the local football star whose family is almost as reviled as hers, she finds a measure of grudging acceptance. But as her dresses begin to arouse competition and envy in town, causing old resentments to surface, it becomes clear that Tilly's mind is set on a darker design: exacting revenge on those who wronged her, in the most spectacular fashion.

This is a clever, well-crafted novel, especially so as it is the author's debut novel. The plotline has a gothic darkness, and the sharply defined characters remind one of Dylan Thomas' cast in *Under Milkwood*. If anything, there is an unnecessarily heavy cast of great characters. As the novel progresses, we sense that we are not expected to see the plot as totally believable; the finale has all the elements of high farce. However, the writing is engaging and the novel moves at a cracking pace. It is only on closing the pages of *The Dressmaker* that we can really reflect on the importance of acceptance and forgiveness, particularly within a small community such as Dungatar. This novel has been made into a highly successful film of the same name, starring Kate Winslet as Tilly.






Stargazing in Strathbogie
