Strathbogie Tableland Landcare Group (STLG)

STLG is currently engaged in a number of activities around the Tableland.

Tree planting

Every year, President Bert Lobert compiles a bulk buy of indigenous tube stock for sale to Tableland residents at the discounted price of \$1 each. This year we have also purchased 3

Hamilton planters for loan. This will make the task of getting the plants into the ground easier. Over the past 4 years, our stock of guards, weed mats and stakes has been depleted. This stockpile is being increased to cater for the next 1000 plantings.

Track Management and Weed Control

If you happen to bump into Landcare members Barry Hall, Sean Mathews or those on a working bee using their mowers, chainsaws or whipper snippers to keep the Bridge to Bridge track open, don't forget to give them a pat on the back. This work goes on all year. Without it the track would quickly succumb to overgrowth and tree falls.

Complementing this work, cooperation with Parks Victoria has resulted in regular summer slashing between the township and the riparian zone.

If you have walked along the Bridge to Bridge track at all this year, you would be hard pressed not to notice the significant reduction in woody weed infestation. Continuing STLG funded weed control is paying dividends, particularly in the suppression of blackberry, holly and honeysuckle.

With this success in mind, last year STLG extended the weed control program along the northern bank of Spring Creek through to Magiltan Creek. Our plan is to keep up the attack again this year, with the intention of reestablishing the dominance of local indigenous flora. We hope to see you at the Spring Creek Reserve, 1000hrs, for our Oct 8 AGM to do a group assessment of the results to date and flagging for areas to tackle next.

Roadside Weed Management

Landcare groups collaborate with Strathbogie Shire to plan for roadside conservation management, as is required of local government. STLG Committee member David Jamieson assists with contractor direction, weed management and vegetation conservation. A roadside evaluation of specific weed infestations and significant trees are amongst the initiatives undertaken in this area.

Alternate Fertiliser Trials

David Jamieson has also been the driving force behind this long term research comparing different fertilisers in real time under local conditions. This project is soon to be concluded. Watch out for the Field Day (TBA) and some very interesting results.



Councillor News

Hello Again,

In this month's Councillor news, I thought I would touch on the concept of participation.

On Monday, 11 September, I was very pleased to attend the Peranbin School Sports Day. What impressed me most was how the students enthusiastically participated in all the events. Students had the opportunity to perform at their best, but just as importantly all participated in a supportive and encouraging environment. I don't think I have ever been to a sports day where everyone competed with a smile. Congratulations to the staff and parent organisers and, of course, all the participants.



In a local government sense, participation is also very important. I believe citizen engagement and participation results in better service delivery outcomes. At the first meeting of this Council, I moved a motion to decentralise the conducting of Council Meetings away from Euroa only. The motion passed by the narrowest of margins on the night, but now I think the whole Council would agree that taking Council out to where the residents live is a good strategy. The September Council Meeting was held in Graytown. It was the first time Council has ever convened in that part of the Shire and over 20 locals came and told Council what needed to be done to lift service standards in that area.

The Shire needs to do more to make itself accessible to residents. The Customer Service Request System needs upgrading, so that residents can be kept informed about the progress of their request after they have submitted it. Council will consider improvements to the computer software later this year.

We have our own current example of participation here on the Tableland, with the construction of a picnic shelter on Shire land near the corner of the Euroa Road and Spring Creek Road. I believe, when completed, this facility will be a valuable addition for locals and visitors.

The project started because a resident, Tony Dawson, put in the time and research to convince Council that spending funds on a shelter in that area would have value. Council wants to ensure that the project meets the community need, which is why it is going about it in a participatory way. A project team of a Shire Project Manager, Tony Dawson, Doug Watson (representing STAG) and myself will oversee the project (scope, design, implementation, etc.). The recommendation of the project group will come back to the community in coming weeks. I would like to thank Tony and Doug for making their expertise, perspective and time available. A great example of participation.

People, of course, participate in all different ways. For anyone who has an interest in Community Planning (identifying and implementing actions important to the local community, acting as a point of reference when Council seeks public input, advising Council on initiatives for the Council Plan and Budget) then I recommend participating in the Shire's Community Planning Reference Group. The Strathbogie Tableland Action Group meets every two months—the next meeting will be the first Monday in December, 7.30pm at the Strathbogie Hall. A great way to get involved.





"TARGA HIGH COUNTRY RETURNS TO STRATHBOGIE SHIRE"

One of the biggest road rallies in Australia is coming back to the Strathbogie Shire this November.



Three short-term road closures have been approved by Council for the eighth annual Targa **Strathbogie** High Country rally on Friday, 10 November.

All vehicles involved in the competitive rally will stop in Binney Street, Euroa for lunch and a public car display, as they have done in previous years.

The roads affected by the event (and the times they are closed) are:

- Galls Gap Road (between Euroa-Mansfield Road and Kippings Road) 9am-3pm
- Harry's Creek Road (between Creek Junction Road and Hays Road) 9.35am-3pm
- Binney Street, Euroa (between Railway Street and Brock Street) 10.08am-2.38pm

Strathbogie Shire Mayor Amanda McClaren said Targa Australia have sent letters to each resident/ratepayer with properties in the 3666 and 3669 postcodes informing them of the closures and event.

"In addition to this, Council will arrange letters to be mailed to specific properties located on both the Galls Gap Road and Harry's Creek Road legs where the property address and mailing address do not match," she said. "Council reminds residents who live on they closed roads that they will not be able to leave their homes or access their properties during this time until the roads are re-opened."

She said the entire region would be promoted around the world during the event.

"This is a very big thing for our community and will do wonders for the local economy as well as showcase what our beautiful Shire has to offer in terms of scenery and attractions," she said.

In the case of medical emergencies occurring for affected residents during the road closure period, the race will be stopped to allow access of emergency vehicles. Targa will also have an intensive care paramedic on site which will enable faster than normal access to medical treatment. Marshals will be stationed at all road closure points during the closures, providing advice to drivers of approaching vehicles of alternative detour routes to the specific destination they are seeking. "SECOND ROUND OF GRANTS PROGRAM ANNOUNCED"

Community groups, event organisers and everyday Strathbogie Shire residents have another chance to apply for Council's 2017-18 community grants program.

Council has awarded close to \$30,000 to community groups as part of the 2017 -2018 Community Grants Program.

The entire grant funding allocation, worth \$56,500 was spread out into four categories:

Community Matching Grants, Events Grants, Quick Response Grants and the William Pearson Bequest.

Eight applications were received and the successful grant recipients are:

- Nagambie Mechanics Institute sanding and re-sealing of the hall flooring \$4450
- Strathbogie Golf Club outdoor furniture and BBQ \$3140
- Euroa Agricultural Society NR Ralston Pavilion, flexible exhibition and event improvements \$5000
- Avenel Recreation and Cricket Reserve seating and undercover area at the new skate park redevelopment - \$5000
- Avenel Tennis Club kitchen refurbishment \$4898
- Strathbogie Memorial Hall Strathbogie Arts Show \$1680
- Violet Town Business Group (auspiced by VTAG) The Nightmare Continues \$3000
- Euroa Citizens Band funding stipends for musical directors and some annual expenditure \$2500

Due to there being significant funding still available Council have decided to offer Strathbogie Shire residents another opportunity to benefit from community grant funding with a second round opening on **Monday September 11th 2017**.

Mayor Amanda McClaren encouraged all Strathbogie Shire residents and community groups to take advantage of this second round of the Community Grants Program.

This round will be open for applications for Community Matching Grants and Events Grants only and will close on Friday 27th October 2017.



<u>CFA News</u>—It is the end of September! Which means there is

not much longer until our fire season is upon us. Please make sure that you clean up your property of any obvious fire hazards.

And, although there is no guarantee that you will have a fire truck attending your property in the event of a bush fire, the image below shows that

size the trucks now are—and they will need in excess of this clearance for a fire truck to be able to access your house, sheds and property along your driveway.

The usual truck is 3m tall, 3m wide and 8m long, and weighs 13 tonnes. It requires a turning circle of in excess of 22m. Trucks cannot access any property without adequate clearance.

Clean ups are really important! Due to multiple out-breaks around Victoria, expect fire restrictions to come in VERY EAR-LY this fire season. It is NEVER too early to clean up!


