The students have written some great reports and have also been making models of water mites, water boatmen, back swimmers, nymph mayflies etc.

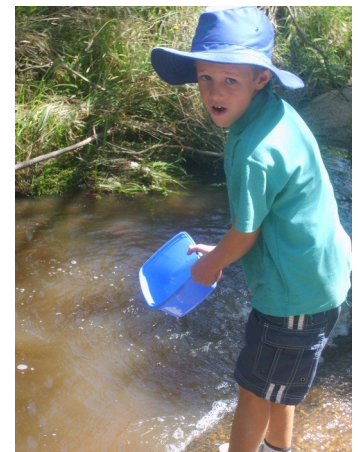
Water Beastie Hunt by Jack McDonald
