Planning for a Euroa Micro Grid

A \$6 million project, led by Euroa Environment Group, will demonstrate the economic opportunities for shared renewable energy and battery assets in communities.

A microgrid is a small network of electricity users with a local supply of power that can function independently of the electricity grid, delivering energy security, sustainability and cost savings for those in the network.

A microgrid generally operates while connected to the grid, but importantly, it can break off and operate on its own using local energy generation in times of crisis like storms or power outages. Microgrids also share excess energy produced back into the network for other users.

The Euroa Micro Grid will reduce the local demand for electricity from the grid and reduce the need for seasonal diesel generators. In doing so, the community of Euroa will demonstrate an economic alternative for local renewable generation for network operators.

Euroa Environment Group will work with Mondo Power and Globird Energy as well as 14 businesses within Euroa which will install 589 kW of new solar PV and up to 400 kWh of new batteries.

The project may eventually extend to the residential community of Euroa and to other towns as it will demonstrate how a microgrid can operate.



Hello Again, Cr Alistair Thomson

I would like to take the opportunity to update the community on Shire projects that have a focus on the Strathbogie Tableland.

Roads

The Shire's '0 to 1' roads program that upgrades gravel roads with a residence has recommenced after the winter. The program takes roads that were previously unmaintained (except for emergency access) and by reforming, creating drains and applying gravel, brings the roads to a standard where they will be included in the Shire's annual maintenance program. In this financial year Steens Road, Brookleigh Road (eastern end) and Vrolands Lane will be completed. In the 2017/18 financial year 140 km of '0' roads were converted.

Flood Damage

The flood damage sustained by the 200mm rain event in early December, 2017, should be fully repaired by the end of October. Over 1000 items of flood damage totalling \$5 million will be funded through the Government's Natural Disaster Relief Fund. In addition, the Shire will contribute \$250k in additional funds to complete flood prevention works on roads susceptible to frequent water damage such as Galls Gap Road.

Picnic Shelter

You will have seen stalled earthworks for the picnic shelter at the entrance to the township. The original design for the shelter used concrete footings. Unfortunately, during excavation of the site it was found that there was too much rock to sink footings. The structure will now be attached to the concrete slab and this necessitated agreement, a new design and a new permit, delaying the project. Work has now recommenced. I would like to thank David Jamieson and particularly Doug Watson for their input towards the project.


Community Fuel

Following a presentation to Council by the STAG, an application for a planning permit has been made for the self-service community fuel depot at the Recreation Reserve. The project would return the availability of diesel to the Tableland and provide an income source for the community. Community consultation on the application will commence soon.

Recycling and Waste

There was discussion some months ago about the future of the communal recycling facility at the Recreation Reserve. No decision has been made on this facility. It is my view that the facility should not be removed without an extension of the roadside collection service on the Tableland. A decision will be made in conjunction with a revised Shire-wide waste strategy in coming months.

On the topic of waste, the depositing of E-waste (electronic items) into landfill will be banned from 1



July, 2019. Alternative collection methods will be established. As a start, old mobile telephones and

electronic accessories can now be deposited in a collection bin at the Euroa Shire office.



DEWLP Nest Box Deployment Interim Report

DELWP has recently completed a survey of nest box deployment in Victoria. The full results will be published in due course; the map below is from an interim report to participants .The sum total is a little under 10,000 boxes, and usage of boxes by 33 species of native birds and mammals and 6 aliens (Honeybee, Indian mynah, Black rat, Starling, House mouse, Blackbird) was recorded. There appears to be only one current program in the 'Bogies, at the Martin's property in Marraweeney.
