My Favourite Tree: Yellow Box E. Melliodora



When I was a kid, my Port Fairy based grandmother used to buy honey from a local apiarist. The seller called it "Yella Box" and I have loved its distinctive taste ever since. The floral note comes from the nectar in copious masses of white flowers that cover a Yellow Box in full bloom.

Now that I'm a big kid, I often stand in awe of the Melliodora at the top of our hill. This yella box is about 30m high and has many huge trunks swaying in the wind. Until 2 days ago, it was about 30m across at the top. Then, a large bough dropped during the flood storms, missing everything but giving Dana a startle. It is still an impressive 20-25m wide at the crown.

A few weeks ago, I measured the widest point of the base at 3.2m. Now, a mere 2.4, it's hardly a sapling. Soon enough, what's left will bloom again. It is profuse. We'll be able to hear it almost before we see it. The sound of wild honey bees swarming over it transmits a long way and the

butterflies love it too. As do we.

This Yella Box has been around longer than any of us and likely to be around for a good while yet, sitting majestically atop our hill, swaying in the wind.

Roads assessments taking place across Strathbogie Shire



Strathbogie Shire Council engineers have been busily assessing damage to Council roads after the recent flood event.

Strathbogie Shire Council Mayor Cr Laura Binks said teams were working around the clock, hitting the road to review and record areas of concern.

"Our roads assessments and repairs will take some time to complete and that means we must continue to stress the importance of driving safely, and to the conditions," she said.

Strathbogie Shire has more than 2210km of roads – 1465km unsealed and 748km sealed. On top of this there are 521 bridges and culverts to maintain. "We know poor road conditions are frustrating for our community and we are working as hard as we can, but there is no quick fix," Cr Binks said.

Flooding has damaged our roads so badly we must look at repairs that are above and beyond our normal maintenance programs. Assessment process could take up to three months to complete, depending on conditions. The repairs needed on our road network is significant and we will need funding from the State and Federal governments.

"We've already started advocating for this and will continue to fight strongly for support. Our community must see action to improve our road network. In October, we moved a motion at the Municipal Association of Victoria's State Council Meeting to lead a state-wide advocacy campaign calling on the Victorian Government to increase funding for road maintenance. Our motion was supported unanimously, and this will provide strong support to our advocacy."

Health risks from flood water

The heavy rain, floods and storms over the past days may carry pollution into waterways. Floodwater is often contaminated by sewage from overflowing sewerage or septic systems, and by agricultural or industrial wastes and chemicals. If possible, avoid contact with floodwaters to avoid contact with polluted water or soil. If it's unavoidable, follow these tips to avoid infection: • Don't wade through water, even shallow water. If you must enter shallow water, wear solid boots or shoes for protection. • Try to avoid contact with mud and dirt; and wear gloves when handling items contaminated with floodwater. • Cover cuts and scratches with waterproof bandages. Always wash your hands with soap and running water after contact with floodwater and after handling pets or other items that may have been in contact with water or soil. Always wash your hands thoroughly after participating in clean-up activities. In certain conditions, our waterways and beaches can be home to disease-causing bacteria or other contaminants that may pose health risks to swimmers. In areas of flooding, water is likely to be unsuitable for swimming for a longer period of time. Similarly, it may not be safe to use flood water for other purposes.

If your property has a septic system and has been affected by floodwater, a licensed plumber or service technician should assess your septic system for safety and function.

Asbestos can be found in some fibre cement sheeting and pipes, vinyl floor tiles, electrical parts and vehicle brake pads. It is not always possible to tell whether a material contains asbestos by looking at it. If in any doubt: • Do not disturb the material • Take steps to prevent others from disturbing the material.



Recipe of the Month

Thai Fried Rice from the White Family.

Heat the oil in a pan and when hot add the egg. Stir it round to from a thin omelet. When cooked add the chicken and keep stirring for about 2 minutes. Add the vegetables and stir to combine. Mix the soy sauce, fish sauce and sugar, Pour into the pan. Stir well, add the spring onion and garlic. Finally, add the rice, stir well to combine until the rice is hot and ready to serve.


