

## Beautiful Bogie Trees May 2023 – don't forget the habitat trees

You can see many, very old, dead eucalypts like these all around the Tablelands. You may notice that some of these old trees along roadsides have had their upper branches trimmed for safety, but have been left in situ. Due to their large size and old age, many have formed hollows. These are a critical component of habitat for many different species of wildlife, that use tree hollows to shelter in during the day, and as a safe place for their young: owls, tiny *Antechinus* (a mouse sized carnivorous marsupial), sugar gliders, mountain brushtail possums and our beautiful greater gliders, to name just a few. If you can leave them standing, when they are in locations where they are not dangerous, then please do.

## Zero-tolerance approach to off-leash dogs and wandering dogs.

Council is reminding dog owners there is a zero-tolerance policy for dogs being off-leash and unrestrained. All dog owners must ensure their dogs are on a leash when being walked, or confined to their property. Mayor Cr Laura Binks said it had been incredibly disappointing to report there have been seven dog attacks throughout the municipality in the past few weeks.


"These attacks have taken place in both residential and farming areas within Strathbogie Shire," she said. "The incidents have been a result of dogs being off leash or wandering at large and have resulted in serious injuries. Many people in our community do the right thing. We need to ensure they are safe when doing so. It is an owner's responsibility to ensure a dog is properly secured – when out in public you must have your dog on a leash, when your dog is at home it must be contained and unable to escape."

Regulations go a long way to reducing the risk of dog attacks. They are a requirement under section 45 of the Domestic Animals Act. Council has spent many months reminding the community through local media, social media and our regular printed and online newsletters that Council was increasing its proactive patrols regarding responsible pet ownership. Dog owners could be infringed or prosecuted if they do not comply with the Act and if their dog has attacked, it will be seized and owners prosecuted.

## Vote on your preferred artwork to go in Euroa's Seven Creeks Park



## Calling on young learner drivers to sign up for the L2P Program



Strathbogie Shire Council and Berry Street Shepparton are encouraging eligible young drivers to sign up for the VicRoads L2P Learner Driver Mentor Program. The program assists learner drivers aged under 21 years who do not have access to a supervising driver or vehicle to gain the driving experience required to apply for a probationary licence.

Strathbogie Shire Council Mayor Cr Laura Binks said young people who signed up would be matched with fully licensed volunteer mentors and have access to use a sponsored vehicle to gain supervised driving experience. "The best part about L2P is that it is free for eligible young people, funded by the TAC,"

she said. "It's a fantastic way for young learner drivers who struggle with access to a supervising driver or vehicle to build up the required 120 hours to go for their probationary driving test.

To be eligible for the program, learner drivers must be aged 16-20 years, hold a current learner's permit and not have access to either a vehicle, a supervising driver, or both. "If you meet these criteria, you or your parent, school or community group can contact Berry Street on (03) 5822 8100 or email L2PHume@berrystreet.org.au

Qualified drivers can register to become volunteer mentors as well. To do this you must be over 21 years, hold a current full Victorian driver's licence and meet requirements of our local L2P program. 
