Whatever happened to Bogie Tree and what is replacing it?

Bogie Tree has been suspended from Google Groups for an unknown reason. When I, as the administrator of Bogie Tree, log in to the group, this message comes up on my screen:



Banned content warning

Bogie Tree has been identified as containing spam, malware or other malicious content.

Is this message correct? I cannot say. None of the emails which were posted to Bogie Tree just prior to this message appearing showed any sign of any of spam, malware or other malicious content. I have heard that Google (Bogie Tree is a Google group) has upgraded its compliance bots, so maybe we have been incorrectly suspended. In any case, Bogie Tree is still suspended and is not accessible.

So we can continue to communicate with each other, I have created *Strathbogie Tree* (to replace Bogie Tree). Bogie Tree had 503 members (email addresses). I am guessing some of these are no longer used or belong to people no longer living here, or are incorrect addresses. Rather than migrating every address to Strathbogie Tree, I thought it best to send out invitations to every email in the list, requesting people to respond and accept the invitation to join. This will allow me to weed out redundant addresses.

I have sent invitations to everyone who was on Bogie Tree, so if you haven't seen yours, it is most likely caught up in the spam folder on your device. To date (26th Sept) I have added 268 members on *Strathbogie Tree*.

If this is the first you have heard of **Strathbogie Tree** and wish to be included in our new email group, please look in the SPAM folder on your device and accept this new invitation by clicking or tapping the **ACCEPT** button.

If you get an error message, or cannot locate the invitation, please email me directly on stuartb446@gmail.com and I will add you.

Remember, to post messages on the new *Strathbogie Tree*, you will need to use the following email address <u>strathbogie-tree@googlegroups.com</u>



Planting Beautiful Bogie Trees at David Steen's



On Wednesday the 27th of September, we gathered at David Steen's farm in Creek Junction to plant some trees as part of our Landcare/Pizza for trees program. We had a mix of species, including Narrow and Broad Leaved Peppermints (Eucalyptus radiata and E. dives), Manna gums (E. viminalis), Blue Gums (*E. globulus*) and Blackwood Wattle (Acacia melanoxylon). You will notice the latter are currently in flower on the Tablelands, with their beautiful pale lemon blossom. They flower a tad later up here compared to

many areas with lower elevation. David had ripped the area so our planting progressed quickly, and we had lovely views as we worked on this superb, mild, sunny Spring day. We were also able to do a follow up plant at Eddie and Virginia Krummins property – what a bonus. A big thankyou to our planting team. Despite a late start to our planting this year, we have supplied or planted trees at over 10 locations across the Tablelands.

Recipe of the Month

Rosemary, lemon and garlic roast chicken with gravy. From Julie Goodwin Serves 4. Cooking time about1 hour.

Ingredients

1.7-1.8kg chicken (organic or free range)
50g unsalted butter room temperature
1tbs finely chopped rosemary leaves
1/4 cup chopped flat leafed parsley
1 crushed clove of garlic

1 lemon cut in half, zest finely grated

1/2 tspn ground black pepper 1/2 tspn salt 1 brown onion cut in half 1/4 cup of flour 2-3 cups chicken stock



Method

Preheat oven to 180C.

Rinse the chicken, pat dry with a paper towel. In a bowl combine butter, herbs, zest, garlic, salt and

pepper. Using your fingers, start at the neck, separate the skin from the breast, and top of the thighs.

Push the butter mixture under the skin and spread it evenly over breast an thigh tops. Massage the outside of the chicken as well. Place the halved lemon and onion cut side down in the base of a non stick baking dish. Add the rosemary and parsley stalks and sit the chicken atop. Put in the oven with the breast facing the back. 30 minutes later switch it round so the legs are facing the back.

To check the chicken is cooked pierce the thickest part of the thigh with a skewer. The juices should run clear. Alternatively, check if the leg is loose in its socket. The breast should be golden brown with a lovely layer of herbs underneath the skin.

Gravy

Pour off any excess butter, but retain the cooked golden bits. Remove the onion, lemon and stalks. Place the baking dish on the smallest stove element. Use a spatula to stir in the flour and turn the heat low. Add stock a little at a time, stirring until thickened after each addition.

Serve with baby chat potatoes, tabouleh and flatbread.

Have your say: Draft Fire Management Plan

Strathbogie Shire Council is calling on the community's feedback on its Draft Municipal Fire Management Plan. The plan takes a collaborative approach to identify the fire risks and corresponding actions to reduce the likelihood, severity and impacts of fire within the Strathbogie Shire communities. Its overall goal is to have a fire prepared community in the Strathbogie Shire.



"Challenges such as the impact of climate change, the increasing occurrence of major fires, population and residential growth all increase the need for a coordinated and collaborative approach to strategic fire management planning," Cr Binks said. "In Victoria agencies must work collaboratively across state, regional and local government levels with our communities, and business before, during and after emergencies. "This Draft Municipal Fire Management Plan (MFMP) has been developed under legislation introduced in Victoria in 2018 to provide greater cohesion for emergency management planning in Victoria at the state, regional and municipal levels."

It is a sub-plan to the Strathbogie Municipal Emergency Management Plan (MEMP) and was developed by the Fire Management Planning Sub-Committee which is made up of representatives from the Country Fire Authority (CFA), Forest Fire Management Victoria, Victorian Police, Council and other specialist roles as required.

Through the development of the plan, the sub-committee explored the fire-related challenges, risks and opportunities within the municipality to apply a coordinated approach to managing these risks.

The draft plan is based around the following themes: 1. Community Resilience 2. Fuel Management 3. Access/Egress 4. Suppression 5. Capability

The experience and knowledge of the Committee members and partner agencies has been integral in confirming the focus of the strategies and the actions to be undertaken.

The plan will be monitored, and regularly updated with improved treatments or activities. Council is now calling on the community to provide its input to the plan. The draft plan has been reviewed by the Share Strathbogie Community Panel and after incorporating the panel's advice we're now sharing more broadly."



Here at The Euroa Arboretum there are so many opportunities to connect to nature and community. Whether it be through volunteering in the nursery or through some of the educational and fun workshops and events we run for children, such as the seed pod art workshop coming up for Children's Week or recent initiatives such as the Women's Weaving Circle.

Some Volunteer's Stories

"The Euroa Arboretum has helped us to connect to the community as new residents of Euroa. It has also allowed our children to find a sense of belonging to this area and connect with nature. Through volunteering at the Arb we have been able to contribute to the community. Even if it is

a small contribution, it further connects us with the community. My deaf son volunteers at the Arboretum. He is growing his confidence and he is learning to become an independent and valuable member of the society and community he lives in."

The team at the Arboretum has expanded my knowledge of land care and management and helped me feel a valued participant alongside others from the local area. Activities here provide purpose while the connections with fellow volunteers is a boon.

The women's weaving circle at the Euroa Arboretum is a unique and nourishing space for women in our community. Many of the women I met were from smaller neighbouring communities such as Ruffy, Strathbogie and Boho, a few were new to the area. Vic and Isabel were very welcoming and engaging teachers in the art of traditional weaving. I think the combination of weaving with natural materials, yarning about Taungurung country and the welcoming way Cath creates the space with the fire and food is the best well-being activity for women I have ever encountered in the Euroa area. I hope it can continue.

Despite being nestled next to the freeway, the tranquil ambiance dominates as soon as we arrive, even amidst the hum of passing trucks and cars. The Arb has been an absolute delight for our children, as it serves as an ideal location for their bush kinder activities, and we've become accustomed to celebrating their birthdays at the facilities. The children adore playing, running around, and connecting with nature, making it a cherished experience for all. Sharing these memories with friends in the Arb is an exceptional and special way to connect with our local community, and we are grateful that it is only a few moments' drive from our town. We eagerly anticipate making even more memories and seeing the Arb grow more intertwined with the community.

I have cancer. Unfortunately it is a rare type for which there is no treatment or cure. My life since diagnosis now revolves around medical appointments and diagnostic tests to monitor my condition.

I have always been a keen gardener, so to be able to spend time at the Euroa Aboretum nursery is a real treat. I have learned so much since I started my volunteer work at the nursery. The staff at the facility are so lovely. They are kind, helpful and friendly. I am able to work to suit my health (if I am having a bad day I only work an hour or so). Every small amount of work I do at the facility is valued by staff who are verbally grateful for any work done. Other volunteers are all lovely and they happily pass on tips and ideas on how to do the required work as we work. Some of the volunteers have been attending the facility for years! The work you do is not physically demanding. There is no expectation to rush to get work done and you have choices on what work you would like to do on the day. As you work you have some great conversations with those around you.

This work day in the nursery is the highlight of my week. I get the opportunity to forget about my problems and engage in work that is productive and beneficial to the environment plus has the added bonus of being a social outlet. Conversations with like minded people often results in really interesting information sharing.

The area surrounding the Aboretum nursery is beautiful. Birds, frogs and other creatures move in and around the nursery adding an amazing dimension of sound and a pleasant distraction.

We are so fortunate to have this nursery in our community and even more fortunate to have such a dedicated team of wonderful people to run the facility.
