

2023/2024 STAG committee members.

STAG President - just to introduce myself as new chair of STAG.

Adrian Beard

I grew up at Caniambo, just the other side of Violet Town, on an Angus Stud, owned by Malcolm Cameron from Ruffy. My father was manager. I continued as assistant manager.

After the devastating 1982 drought, I purchased a small cropping property (with water) at Cosgrove, which I improved and sold in 1990. I was looking to expand but more acreage at Cosgrove was expensive, so I looked further afield to Griffith, where farming properties were very cheap. Because of the Donald Mackay murder, and the Mafia, no one wanted to live there. I purchased a 600-acre irrigation property near Griffith in the Riverina Murrumbidgee Irrigation Area where I grew, at different times, rice, corn, soybeans, cotton and wheat. But always Angus cattle.

While farming there we, the farmers, tried to stop the deregulation of irrigation, but people with deeper pockets than us and the powers that be, won the battle, so, the destruction of regulated irrigation began. (very touchy subject)

My wife, Pennie was originally from Gillieston, near Kyabram. We first met as 17-year-olds when Pennie and her family moved to Caniambo. We socialised quite a lot but went our separate ways until later. In 1997 Pennie moved up to the farm with her 2 kids, Andrew and Holly.

In 2015 we came to inspect this property with Pennie's sister and husband. We were shown the house with 2 hectares. It didn't suit them but, we went home to Griffith and kept thinking about it. After some time, we noticed it also had 132acres attached so we came back. The agent took us to the top of the hill, where the views are just spectacular. The decision was made to live here, so we went back and proceeded to sell the farm at Griffith. We purchased this property in August 2016 and moved here in June 2017.

The idea was to retire (joke) to our current property at Strathbogie, where we continue to run Angus cattle and a few thoroughbred horses. We have since bought more land in the area. So, our herd has grown from 40 to 140 cows. The cows calve in the spring, which are then grown out to be sold from June to December the following year.

I'm pleased to be involved in STAG and the hall committee. I hope that our skills and experiences can be a positive for the community. Strathbogie Tablelands is a great place to live. We have a very vibrant community with lots of potential to thrive.

I'm very pleased to be home to the area I grew up in.

Recipe of the Month

Pad Thai

From Elaine Davis

Ingredients

250g rice stick noodles

2 lemons juiced

2 tbspn Fish Sauce

2 tbspn brown sugar

2 tbspn peanut oil

2 thinly sliced chicken breast fillets

500g green prawns peeled and deveined

3 spring onions thinly sliced on the diagonal

3 small red chillies deseeded and finely chopped

2 eggs lightly beaten

1 cup bean sprouts

1/4 cup peanuts roasted (optional finely chopped)

1/2 cup coriander seeds Lime or lemon wedges to serve

Method

Place noodles into a heat proof bowl and cover with hot water. Stand until tender, then drain and rinse under cold water. Combine lemon juice, fish sauce and sugar in a jug. Whisk to combine.

Heat a wok over high heat, add oil, swirl to coat. Add chicken, stir fry for 2 minutes until golden. Add prawns, onions and chillies. Stir fry for 2-3 minutes or until prawns turn pink. Add noodles, stir fry for 2 minutes. Add lemon juice mixture to wok. Toss to combine. Slowly pour eggs over the noodles. Stir fry for 1 minute. Add sprouts. Toss well. Serve. Sprinkle with peanuts, coriander & citrus wedges.

Walk of the Month



The Lunette Walk, Winton Wetlands https://walkingmaps.com.au/walk/5815

This 3.5k walk showcases excellent views over Winton Wetlands swamps. It follows a lunette. A lunette is the rare geological feature of a sand dune found on the edge of wetlands. Formed by millennia of sand and soil movement across the swamp, the process creates a crescent moon shape.

From the ridgeline there are uninterrupted views across the water on both sides. At the return point of the walk you can climb to the summit of a circular hillock for 360 degree views. When the wetlands are full this last area may be cut off, but the rest of the walk will still be well worthwhile because of the vast aquatic scenery spread out around you from the dune top.

The wildlife exposure is second to none. Birdlife abounds. We counted thirty-three species within the first fifteen minutes of walking and spotted fiftysix by the time we got back. During inflows, the waterbird and raptor population booms. There are plenty of kangaroos, wallabies, echidnas, turtles, frogs and very beautiful snakes to be seen as well - walk quietly to hear or observe them going about their natural activity.


