Burnoff Advice from the CFA

After a local incident, and subsequent debrief by the Strathbogie Fire Brigade, I have been asked to put a few notes together for the public and volunteers so that everyone on the plateau has an understanding of what's required.

Firstly, as a landholder (owner or leasee), when it is outside fire restriction period, you have the right to burnoff any vegetative matter, within limits of Shire By Laws. You do not have to notify neighbours or call the burnoff notification number 1800 668 511. However common courtesy suggests you should, especially if your smoke is going anywhere near a neighbour's house, or public roadway.

If your fire gets into ANY public land, it is deemed out of control and a breach of Section 11 of the Summary Offences Act, and any member of the public has the right to call the fire brigade on 000. If this happens the local CFA HAS to respond and investigate.

You may not wish the fire brigade to respond, and even protest the fact, but under legislation we have to investigate. If you protest too strongly either physically or verbally, any member of the firebrigade has the right to call for the police to attend. If the member wishes to press charges the perpetrator will be up for assault, and interfering with emergency personnel in the act of their duties. (Section 107 CFA Act, amendment Emergency Workers Harm Act 2020)

So, if you see any member of the CFA in their uniform at a fire please be nice, as they mightn't want to be there either, and have only responded to help someone in need.

If the CFA has responded to an out of control fire on public or private land, and a tree has been affected, we may be calling for an excavator to push the tree over. This is for two reasons, one is we don't own heavy machinery, and for safety reasons we are not chainsaw felling trees. The second is that the CFA can't leave an engaged tree in dangerous condition, that may fall at any stage into the future.

Unfortunately, excavators costs money, which means as the person who lit the escaped burnoff, you will be asked to pay. And a big warning here people, that means float hire and machine hire. Recently due to Sunday rates a local fire cost the landowner over \$5000 for an escaped burnoff. (Please note that in a case of accidental ignition, a landowner will not incur these fees). And if the fire is deemed negligent the CFA, not your local brigade, may choose to litigate under the summary offences act, as well.

So, to avoid all the nasties, make sure when burning off that you have a firefighting unit. Even a small fire can creep, and a small splash of water can stop it with ease. If burning on or near the road verge, never leave the scene unattended. Consider signage especially if the smoke is likely to go over the road. *Cont page 3...*

Protecting your water meter in winter



Goulburn Valley Water is reminding people not to forget about the humble water meter as winter descends on the region and near zero overnight temperatures become common place. While we are still in the early days of June there are some important considerations to be made before that thin layer of ice starts to form on the lawns of our homes and windscreens of our vehicles.

GVW Managing Director Dr Steve Capewell said the extreme cold of winter could impact the supply of water to people's homes, something many of us take for granted. "Most water meters and pipes sit above the ground and are open to the elements. The water sitting inside. meters and pipes can freeze when exposed to very cold temperatures. This will result in your property having no water and can lead to broken or split pipes," he said.

It is important for customers to remember that although meters remain GVW property, customers were responsible for maintenance and protection of a meter on their property. If a meter or the attached pipework is damaged or vandalised (regardless of the cause)

the customer will be required to employ a plumber to undertake repairs. Dr Capewell said good news was there were a number of simple and inexpensive ways to ensure your water supply was not impacted by the cold. "As is generally the case, prevention is better than cure.

Should your meter freeze you will likely notice a severe drop in water pressure and possibly a complete loss of water," he said. Here's some advice on how best to protect your water meter from the winter cold.

- If the temperature is forecast to drop below zero, cover the meter to trap the air around it and stop the water inside it from freezing. This will protect your meter from splitting or bursting, and help prevent water from freezing inside the pipes to ensure you've still got access to water for your morning coffee and shower.
- You can use regular household items to cover your meter, such as: plastic tubs, cardboard boxes, blankets or buckets.
