SHARING OUR ROADS

Safer Roads Strathbogie is a local group recently created in response to the growing reports of dangerous driving on the Tableland and injury to wildlife. SRS aims to advocate and promote safer driving to reduce the risk to human safety, as well as wildlife killed and injured on our roads.

We all want safe roads as they are our essential network allowing us to go about our daily business. Where collisions with animals do occur, these incidents can be dangerous and distressing for the driver, and cause considerable damage to vehicles and wildlife.

Please slow down between dusk and dawn when animals are most active. This will reduce the risk of hitting wildlife and damaging your vehicle.

If you do find injured wildlife, **please do not call local carers directly** as many carers are at capacity. Wildlife carers are often feeding babies through the night and they also need their privacy.

Please **contact Wildlife Victoria on 03 8400 7300** - they are on call to help. Wildlife Victoria will register the case and locate the closest available carer for the animal.

If you encounter wildlife whilst driving on our roads, human safety must always come first.

If you can do so SAFELY:

slow down and where possible, either stop or steer around the animal in a safe and controlled manner.

NEVER violently swerve to avoid hitting an animal as this can cause you to lose control of your vehicle or hit oncoming traffic.

If you can't avoid the animal safely, you may have to hit it to avoid injury or death to yourself and others.

(Information sourced from : vicroads.vic.gov.au – Animal welfare) If you have hit wildlife and IT IS SAFE TO DO SO:

Stop, ensure your car is well off the road, and put your hazard lights on.

If the animal is dead:

Move the body well away from the road, if you can do so safely.

Note your exact location with your smartphone, and note landmarks, a nearest address or crossroad.

Call Wildlife Victoria's Emergency Response Service on **03 8400 7300**. This number is staffed by trained, experienced operators 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

Even when the animal is dead it is important to report this to Wildlife Victoria as soon as possible, so a trained local volunteer can check the pouch. They also collect data regarding injured wildlife.

If the animal is alive and on the road:

Call 000 as large injured and distressed animals pose a hazard to road users. Please also call Wildlife Victoria and a trained macropod rescuer can be deployed.

(Information sourced from: How to help injured wildlife on the roads – Wildlife Victoria)

If you have found an injured native animal on your property or in a public place, again please call Wildlife Victoria.

Pouch checks:

Female kangaroos, wallabies, koalas, wombats, possums and echidnas carry young in a pouch. Even if killed, there is still a good chance that the young in her pouch will have survived. They can survive in the pouch for up to 2 weeks after their mother's death, depending on circumstances.

When a Wildlife Victoria volunteer checks the wildlife, they will:

ensure the animal is off the road, check the pouch if female, and spray paint them with a cross to show other volunteers they have been checked.

if a joey is found in the pouch - they will take the joey to the nearest vet for assessment. Once assessed, the joey will be transported to a registered wildlife rehabilitator.

Each year Wildlife Victoria receives around 110,000 calls for wildlife assistance from the public. The top cause of injury to wildlife is speed and road-related accidents.



Major Road Patching Underway in Strathbogie



Strathbogie Shire is set to undertake major road patching on several local roads throughout August and September in preparation for resealing next year.

The patching works will take place on Euroa-Strathbogie Road, Spring Creek Road, Merton-Strathbogie Road and Creighton's Creek Rd.

The works, which total nearly \$718,000 (including GST), are part of Council's 2023-24 Capital Works budget.

Administrator Peter Stephenson acknowledged that these roads had been earmarked as part of the 2023-24 Capital Works program.

'It is essential that we prioritise safety across our 2,214 km road network, and we recognise that these sealed roads require extensive patching on

the failed sections.'

'Like everyone, I am aware of the potholes and poor road conditions across Victoria. However, we are focusing this year's budget on repairing these critical roads, which are heavily used by both cars and major transport.'

The roads will remain open to traffic during the patching works, with appropriate traffic management in place.

Mr. Stephenson expects the works to be completed by the end of September, weather permitting, with resealing scheduled for early next year.



This important local emergency planning document seeks to create greater awareness of the emergency risks in the Strathbogie Tableland area and identifies actions that can be taken to improve the community's preparedness and ability to recover from these emergencies.



STAG Communications subcommittee

Strathbogie Granite Project

This ongoing project continues the collaboration between University of Melbourne and Stellenbosch University in South Africa. In Autumn 2024 Professor Alex Kisters, until recently Head of the Geology Department at Stellenbosch, spent time teaching postgraduates in Melbourne and Bendigo, and visiting some of our key locations within the Strathbogie granite. A favourite was the walk up the Seven Creeks gorge seeing so much granite, cliff faces and waterfalls on what was a perfect day. He spent some time explaining the origin of those 'cracks' we often see in the granite (geologically, called joints); it turns out they play an integral part in the creek structure and landscape of the plateau. We also spent time farther west looking at the geology of the Tallarook plateau and Callen Range. Alex passed on his gratitude for the great support and hospitality provided by the community for our ongoing research. In Spring 2024, Caitlin Jones, a postgraduate from Stellenbosch will join us for some field work in the Strathbogies.

Thank you again for land access and sharing knowledge of so many special sites.

Why I joined the CFA.

I had a good friend who was in the CFA. He had grown up with his father being a captain and so he joined at an early age. The stories he told were awe inspiring, the ferocity of the fires of 2009 in Kinglake and of surviving burn overs on the back of the truck.

Johnno and I bought our bit of land and moved from the Melbourne suburbs to Strathbogie. We were going to live in the bush. I felt it was a natural thing to do, to join the local brigade to train in the skills of firefighting. If anyone could teach me the skills needed to survive a bushfire the CFA could. I volunteered and in doing so it was a nice way to be part of something local and give forward.

The rewards of volunteering have been surprisingly immense. The comradery shared on the truck, helping people in challenging times, seeing other parts of the country, being part of a team and making a difference are some of the benefits. Pushing beyond my comfort zone and putting all the training into effect has helped me grow personally. It has been 10 years, and I have now stepped up into the role of 4^{th} lieutenant.

August Landcare Planting Field Day at Bullagreen, Strathbogie

On August 25th, we had a most successful and fun Landcare Field Day at David and Libby Hamilton's property on the Euroa-Strathbogie Road. All up there were 20 people who attended, which really helped with getting the job done – thanks Team! We started the day with a brief discussion about which trees and other native plants were suitable for properties on the Tableland; fencing and guards to protect plants from stock, rabbits, roos etc; soil preparation; the best time of year to plant; tree spacing, watering, and the advantages of planting native species on properties.

Our aim for the day was to connect the excellent native roadside vegetation along the Strathbogie-Euroa Rd, in front of the property, by planting a corridor of vegetation up to a patch of forest on Mt Spy, which includes a land-locked bushland reserve (Wondoomarook). After a delicious morning tea (thank you so much Kay!) we got to work and planted about 250 plants, all native species, and mainly those that occur naturally on the Tableland. These were all from the Euroa Arboretum. David had ploughed and fenced the corridor area, so the planting was relatively easy. Luckily we have had some recent rain, so the soil moisture was good, despite it being a little late in the planting season.

This type of slightly larger-scale revegetation is important for both on-farm and broader landscape/ environmental health. Planting trees and shrubs on your property provides excellent shelter belts for stock, both in summer and winter. It also provides useful habitat for many of our local wildlife species, and in particular corridors can function to connect isolated patches of habitat for wildlife. Being visible from the main road, we'll all be able to see over the next years, how our revegetation effort is progressing when we drive past (and the Koalas will LOVE it as we have planted quite a number of their favourite food trees!).

Recipe of the Month:

Roast Pumpkin with Walnuts & Beans Method

from Terry Frewin

Ingredients

2 cups pumpkin in 2cm chunks

- 1 tbspn olive oil
- 1 tspn sea salt

Cracked black pepper to taste

- 1 tbspn pure maple syrup
- 1 cup walnut pieces
- 1 can rinsed cannelli beans
- 1 tbspn chopped fresh rosemary
- 1 handful baby spinach leaves Diced feta

Preheat oven to 150 degrees

Spread walnuts on tray and roast for 5 minutes. Set aside to cool.

Increase oven heat to 180 degrees

Place pumpkin on tray and drizzle with oil and salt. Cook about 20 minutes until pumpkin starts to change colour. Drizzle with maple syrup and continue cooking for 10-15 minutes or until cooked and brown. Cool slightly. Add to large bowl with walnuts. Gently toss adding beans, rosemary and pepper. Stir in baby spinach and diced feta.

Agriculture Victoria Key Information Following a Fire

IT IS IMPORTANT THAT THIS INFORMATION IS RETAINED AS IT MAY NOT BE EASILY ACCESSED AFTER A FIRE

Only return to your property once emergency services declare it safe to enter.



Livestock

After an emergency an assessment of livestock for injury is essential. Livestock producers need to be aware that disease can spread more easily following an emergency.

As soon as farmers are able to safely access their properties, it is important that livestock be assessed quickly and appropriate action taken to ensure the welfare of their animals.

Livestock producers need not wait for Agriculture Victoria staff

to visit to euthanise impacted livestock if they are confident they can do so humanely. It is recommended that animals be photographed for insurance purposes.

Bushfire may result in large numbers of animal carcasses requiring disposal. Farmers who do not have the capability to dispose of dead stock should contact the Shire for assistance.

Managing surviving livestock

Stock that are likely to survive should be placed in a clean (not burnt) paddock that has soft soils, appropriate shade and shelter, good-quality feed and water. Many animals will not be hungry for several days and may lose condition before starting to recover.

Feed

Under the Emergency Fodder Distribution Agreement, the Victorian Farmers Federation (VFF) arranges the collection and distribution of fodder.

No two situations of feed availability will be the same. Decisions about feed will need to be reviewed over time. Options of managing stock can be impacted by gaining access to sales at saleyards and access to fodder. Options may include:

agistment sell stock feed stock

If feeding stock is an option Agriculture Victoria staff can assist with developing a feed budget. This identifies the amount and quality of feed required for the number and type of stock and also how long it is required for.

If accepting donated feed, consider establishing a sacrifice paddock or stock containment area to reduce the spread of any potential weeds. Also be aware that the quality of feed may vary, and this will impact the amount stock require.

Water

Water availability may be reduced by fire suppression activities and the quality may be affected by contamination from ash and soil.

Dehydration can be a problem with stock often refusing to drink water if it is polluted or tastes different from their normal supply. It's important to watch your stock carefully to ensure they are drinking adequately.

Planning for water availability should include carefully evaluating current reserves and assessing if water quality has been impacted.
