The aim of this action plan is to continue to build greater community resilience, during and after emergencies, by increasing the awareness of our local emergency risks and the steps that our community and individuals can take to prepare for, respond to and recover from these emergencies.

In particular, this action plan will provide avenues to achieve and enhance the plans already developed by our community and provide additional strategies to support people living on the Tableland.

Preparation is key

For Community Emergency Information for the Tableland visit www.strathbogie.org In an extreme weather event power, water, telecommunications, and transport networks may be impacted, causing disruptions and isolation to households and communities.

Emergency Services will have high demand in an emergency event. As a part of your emergency plan, households should be prepared for up to 72 hours of isolation.

Prepare a household emergency kit. Download the VicEmergency App and have a battery powered radio ready to receive warnings and updates. Monitor warnings and be prepared to act.

Emergency management is a shared responsibility between individuals, communities, Council and agencies. Preparation is key to reducing impacts and to supporting emergency services.



This LEAP has been developed as part of the LEAPing into Resilience Project, a joint initiative between Mansfield, Strathbogie and Murrindindi Shire Councils. This project received grant funding from the Australian Government. It is the outcome of joint community, agency and Council collaboration and actions are shared between all parties.

In February 2024, a Strathbogie Tableland Steering Group was formed to help guide the LEAP process in the community. In April 2024, community members came together to identify the ways in which the Strathbogie Tableland community can build on their existing emergency preparedness, and these ideas formed the LEAP actions. The LEAP project thanks the Strathbogie Tableland community and participating agencies for their contributions to the development of this plan.

LEAP Priority Actions

Strathbogie Tableland local risks are: Fire (bushfire and grass fire), Storms and Animals (stock and wildlife) on roads. Power outages are a frequent occurrence, 14 incidents with 130 hours of outage recorded over a 6-month period. Localised flooding can also occur after heavy rainfall events.

The identified impacts of these events were injury/fatality (human and animal), loss of power and communications, blocked access roads and negative mental/emotional health impacts on the community. Other identified impacts were loss of infrastructure and financial losses.



Numerous activities contribute to this, including a monthly local newsletter (Tableland Talk), a local email network (Strathbogie Tree), a Communications Committee, a Tableland website (with information on how to connect and communicate, a community directory, emergency preparation, etc.), the Strathbogie Tableland Action Group, an Emergency Committee, CFA District Training, a locally run annual Bushfire Sunday training day for the community, and several Community Fireguard Groups.
