Notes from the (Strathbogie Tableland Action Group) STAG meeting held in the Strathbogie Hall Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> January

#### Items discussed:

Standpipe installation at the recreation Ground to provide a quick refill when required

Planning a music event at the Strathbogie Hall

- The completion of the LEAP (Local Emergency Action Plan) for the Strathbogie Tableland was tabled. The plan details actions that can be taken by individuals, our community, the CFA, the Strathbogie Shire Council, and other groups after we experience a significant local emergency, in particular bush/grass fire.
- Copies of the plan are on line on the Council website, our local community website <u>https://strathbogie.org</u> and hard copies are available at the Strathbogie general store, hall, golf club and recreation ground, the Boho South Hall and the Kelvin View School Hall or by contacting <u>kathstuart60@gmail.com</u>
- Discussion on the Strathbogie Cup Weekend festival. 2024 was a great success but more volunteers are required to run the 2025 event. It is noted that several of our local groups will benefit from donations coming from income generated from the event.
- Safer Roads Strathbogie gave an update of their activities. This includes working with Council on the strategic positioning of 12 new "SLOW DOWN Wildlife Zone" signs on the Seven Creeks flats and roads across the Tableland. Additionally, SRS has been in communication with Council regarding the Shire's application for TAC funding for upgrades to Euroa-Strathbogie and Harrys Creek Roads. We wait to hear of the outcome of the application and any impact it will have on speed limits on those roads.
- Discussion on the Rural Residential Land Use and Urban Growth Strategy which proposes changes to the density in land use and proposed growth in and around local townships and rural residential locations. There was a community consultation held in the Strathbogie township and from the feedback from that, STAG has put together a *Continues page 3 .....*

response back to Council. Our response has been sent to the community on BogieTree

A proposal to establish a community shuttle bus was raised and discussed. It is thought that such a service between Euroa and our Tableland would greatly benefit our community, including those who are elderly and/or less mobile. This is an exciting project well worth much investigation. We will be seeking community feedback to gauge support for such a service.

Discussion on Tableland Talk and more input/articles from local groups and individuals is sought. The Communications subcommittee are planning to update our Tableland Community Directory. We

discussed how to fund this.

A new Bogie Tree email group is up and running after Goggle Groups shut down Strathbogie Tree. There are presently 371 members on this email group.

The generator at the golf club has been updated and needs to be housed in a different enclosure. We discussed holding a movie night at the Strathbogie Hall utilising the new projector and screen We discussed the ongoing issue with rubbish put in and around the recycling bins at the recreation ground. We are looking for solutions to this issue.

The exact location of the proposed footpath from the Recreation Ground and Main Street, Strathbogie, is being assessed by the relevant Council Officers.

The next STAG meeting will be on 16<sup>th</sup> February 9:30 am at the Strathbogie Memorial Hall

# **Strathbogie Granite Project 2025**



Field work, walks and talks, and data interpretation continue to improve our understanding of the Strathbogie granite; and enable us to share our learnings with the community. However, with the granite being 100 km long and 2000 sq km in area, we still find new places to visit with hidden surprises.

Collaborations have been an important part of this project for several years and will continue into 2025. The International Granite Symposium in Benalla in 2017 made many geologists aware of how interesting our granite is, and several then supported us when we advocated for the government's gravity survey to extend

over the granite. This airborne survey has been completed, and we are looking forward to the release of the data soon.

Alex Kisters visited in early 2024 and continues his contributions from his home base at Stellenbosch University in South Africa. We hope to see him in the field again in mid-2025. Caitlin Jones provided some new field insights during her brief Spring visit, and John Clemens visited in late 2024 to extend his sample collecting to various granites in Victoria. John's work on granites throughout Victoria and beyond helps us understand the exceptional features of Strathbogie compared to other global examples.

Colleagues at the University of Porto in Portugal have a strong granite team and we continue to exchange ideas. This included a face-to-face workshop in Porto in late 2025 where our discussions included Strathbogie granite. And then quite separately a community group in NE England invited me to speak by video about the Strathbogie granite which I did in mid-January.

Closer to home, plans are underway for some Avenel Granite Treks, and hopefully some other community walks covering the many interesting areas farther east. Field work will continue to fill some of the areas where we have significant gaps.

We continue to be grateful for the support and hospitality from landowners and the community who make this research work possible and enjoyable. Comments from our overseas visitors always mention how obliging and friendly everyone is, and they have asked me to convey their combined thanks.

# Help shape the next stage of public art in Euroa



Strathbogie Shire Council is excited to announce Stage Two of Euroa's public art journey.

Collectively the Euroa Chamber of Business and Commerce and the Euroa Action Group received \$50,000 through the Council's 2024 Pitch My Project grant to install one or more new public art pieces in Euroa.

Building on the success of the Euroa's Magpie '*Swoop the Big Barrwarrang*' sculpture at the Euroa Seven Creeks Park, this project seeks to strengthen the connection between this iconic work, businesses in and around Binney Street, and existing art within the community garden.

Strathbogie Shire Council Mayor Claire Ewart-Kennedy said the idea of public art and this opportunity particularly, is to create a cohesive and vibrant public art experience across multiple spaces in Euroa. We are a vibrant and growing tourism destination along with high liveability attractiveness so public art is important to our economic and community development.

'I encourage everyone to share their ideas and feedback on our Share Strathbogie engagement site. Your input will help shape a detailed brief that we can provide to prospective artists in

February, ensuring the final artworks capture the character and stories of our community,' said Cr Ewart-Kennedy.

Here's how you can get involved:

• **Possible Locations**: Tell us where you'd like to see the new art. Suggested locations include Seven Creeks Park, Binney Street, or other areas of Euroa on Council-managed land.

• **Artwork Themes**: Rank your favourite focus areas from history, local flora/fauna, First Nations art, abstract, or your own ideas!

**Other Ideas**: Share your vision, thoughts, or even images of inspiring public art you've seen elsewhere.

In line with Council's **Public Art Policy**, the final artwork will be selected by a consultative panel, including representatives from the Euroa Chamber of Business and Commerce, Euroa Action Group Inc., Council's Art and Culture Officer, and an independent arts professional. This process ensures that the chosen works meet criteria such as relevance to local stories, artistic quality, and enhancement of public spaces.

It's important to note that, unlike the Euroa Magpie sculpture, there will not be a public vote on the final submissions. This change ensures a professional, consistent approach to public art selection.

'We do want you to share your ideas and help shape a vibrant, connected, and meaningful public art experience for Euroa,' Cr Ewart-Kennedy added.

# **Strathbogie Memorial Hall Report**



The Strathbogie Memorial Hall had a very successful fundraising session on Thursday nights at the Rec Ground during November & December. For five weeks the Hall committee and friends made the pizzas for all to enjoy. In total, \$2,941.80 was made and will go towards the installation costs of a new generator. Our thanks go out to all who helped, whether it was in the kitchen, serving or purchasing pizza.

Also, during December, a new solar & battery system was installed at the Strathbogie Memorial Hall. It consists of 10.5kW array of Winaico 450W panels on the north facing roof. This is fed into an 8kw Fronius hybrid inverter, which is coupled to a 5kWh bank of BYD batteries. When it is not recharging the battery bank or powering the Hall's loads, the system exports excess power to the grid and can provide backup power if the grid goes down. Installation was by the team at SolarGain in Wangaratta and designed by Martin Nichol from Sun Real.

When I joined the Hall committee, one of my goals was to install a solar system, so I began to search for appropriate grants for this project. This solar installation was funded generously by the Reduced Emissions Community Grant for \$20,000 from the Strathbogie Shire Council. One more community building that is heading towards energy efficiency and reduced emissions.

Whilst the solar at the Hall currently provides power for the hall, the dream of a community-scale micro grid to share the solar power to the whole Strathbogie township neighbourhood is now achievable and a new goal. The current array takes up a small fraction of the roof space available. This array has great potential to be increased in size. Coupled with a town battery, the system could provide reliable and clean power to the township.

### Welcome to the new Bogie Tree

Many Tablelanders will be aware of the new Bogie tree. Our previous Strathbogie Tree was shut down (without warning) by Google groups, just like they did about 18 months ago to the original Bogie Tree. To stop this from reoccurring, I set up a new Bogie Tree on another service provider called Gaggle Mail. **Here are some tips on how to use this group.** 

If you wish to post a message on BogieTree use this address: <u>bogie-tree@gaggle.email</u> Gaggle Mail allows us to more easily modify how we see our emails, allows us to add or change our name on an email, reply to the whole group or just to the sender, unsubscribe from the group and it also allows each of us to not be part (mute) of any thread of conversation. All of this can be done by clicking on the options which are at the bottom of the emails you receive via the group.

The following footer is at the bottom of each email. Clicking on *My Membership Preferences* will take you to a page that will allow you to edit your name and set how you receive Bogie Tree messages. The footer also gives you the opportunity to respond to an email to the whole group or just to the sender. I ask that if you wish to respond to the sender when buying/swapping/receiving something/etc, **PLEASE tap on** *Reply to sender*, so your response does not go to the whole group. Reply to group

#### What's worth finding out on www.strathbogie.org? The Share Shed.



The Share Shed is a small cob folly on the Main Street in Strathbogie. It was built in January 2021 by Dana Coleman and some local children during the first Covid lockdown.

It's built with local mud and formed into cob walls, all materials were donated and salvaged.

Building the Share Shed was Dana's idea of a Victory Garden. She felt it was important to have a space to enable the community to share during Covid which was keeping people isolated and preventing gatherings.

The idea is to use it as a drop off, pickup, sharing point in Bogie. So far is has been well used to share excess produce like vegies, fruit, preserves, plants, seeds and seedlings. Books, local seeds and handmade cards have been shared by so many across the Tableland.
